 THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD Year A
 SUNDAY 8 January 2023

Dear Friends & Parishioners,

"As soon as Jesus was baptised, the heavens opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending on his like a dove, and a voice spoke from heaven saying, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, my favour rests on him" (Matt. 3:13-17). Jesus' Baptism marks the beginning of his public life and ministry after the hidden years in Nazareth. The Spirit came down on him and the first place it led him to is the desert where he goes without food for forty days and when he was weak, the devil came and tempted him in three ways. That experience prepared and strengthened him for his ministry to bring the Good News to people that "the kingdom of God is at hand".

Parents bring their child from the privacy of their home to the church to be Baptised. That marks the beginning of their child's spiritual life and faith journey in which they are given the same Spirit that Jesus received at his baptism and we are told that "it gave him to power to go about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil" (Acts 10). We too are given the power of the Spirit through our Baptism and other Sacraments, that enable us to make the wise and right decisions and it enables us to go about doing good for the benefit of others.

This Sunday we renew the Promises of our Baptism, made for us by our parents and godparents if we were Baptised as infants or by ourselves if we chose to be Baptised as adults. The sprinkling with Holy Water reminds us of the blessings and graces God gave to us in and through our Baptism and the ways we need to be aware of them in order to grow in a faith relationship with God and our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Being Baptised or having one's child Baptised, but then not actively practicing or living one's faith in relationship with God in the Church is like planting a seed with great potential in the ground but not aiding it to grow by nurturing it. I sometimes think that choosing to be Baptised or have one's child Baptised is like entering into a marriage relationship – in this instance it is a Covenant relationship with God and the Christian community, God's family. The same can also be said about any of the other Sacraments we receive, for they are given to us to nurture and strengthen our relationship with God and his people, not to be a one off event or a disconnected experience from a living faith that bring us into relationship with God and people. *May the Lord bless us and renew in us the grace of our Baptism, so that our sins are washed away and we live in grace and holiness with God and people. Fr John.*
