SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Year A 15th January 2023

Dear Friends & Parishioners,

"Look, there is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world," St John the Baptist said as he pointed people to Jesus (Jn.1:29-34). John knew his mission was "to prepare a way for the Lord" so that people would receive the Jesus when he came. John testified that he saw the Holy Spirit come down on Jesus like a dove and anoint him as the Chosen One of God and said that baptism by Jesus would change people's lives with the power of the Spirit. He considered that the most important thing was for people to be set free from their sins by Jesus, the "Lamb of God who had come to take away the sins of the world".

In the Old Testament people sacrificed lambs and creatures to God as a sacrifice so that their sins might be forgiven. The great sacrifice was that of the Passover Lamb, whose blood was sprinkled on the doorposts of people's homes as they prepared to go from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the promised land (Exodus 12). That blood gave people protection from death and set them free for a new life in the Promised Land. Jesus, was the Passover Lamb in the New Testament whose blood was shed on the Cross to take away people's sins and give them new life of grace in God's kingdom. That new life of grace was given by his rising from the dead at the resurrection and pouring out his Spirit on all mankind at Pentecost.

We have just celebrated the joy of Christ's birth and coming in the world with light at Christmas. Isaiah (49:3-6) prophesied that the Messiah or Christ would be "the light of the nations" (the non-Jewish peoples), so that God's "saving grace would reach to the ends of the earth". Sacrifice is of its nature difficult, but Jesus offered the greatest sacrifice, his life, to take away our sins so that everyone might "live in the glorious freedom of the children of God" (Romans 8:16-21). Whilst these events and saving mysteries happened in the past, they are made present to us here and now in the Mass as the Sacred Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are read, and Christ's Sacrifice of his life, is made present to us on the Altar in the holy Eucharist. At Mass we repeatedly proclaim him the "the Lamb of God who takes away our sins and the sins of the world". In order to conform our life to Christ, and accept his grace to save us from sin and its effects we need to make our own the response in today's Psalm 39 as we say; "Here I am, Lord, I come to do your will". *May we humbly sacrifice our will to God's will in love and truth. Fr John*
