FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER Good Shepherd Sunday 7th May 2017 My dear People,

Jesus said, "I am the gate of the sheepfold...anyone who enters through me will be safe" (John10:1-10). Nowadays many people use gates to improve their security. A shepherd used the gate of the sheepfold to let the sheep in to safety, he would then lie down at the gate to protect his herd so that one could only enter or leave through him. Jesus speaks of himself as the gate through which people go safely in and out. He is "The Good Shepherd, who lays down his life for his sheep". He tells us that all who belong to him and know him, listen to his voice and follow him.

Psalm 23, "The Lord is my Shepherd", on Good Shepherd Sunday, prophesies that God will send a shepherd, to call his people to follow him and he will lead them to safety. He nourishes and feed his people; leads them to food and water, gives rest to their souls and revives their drooping spirits. He guides them along the right path, protects them from evil and frees them from fear. He comforts them and prepares an eternal banquet for them – for he will always be faithful to them. These hopes and prophecies were all fulfilled in and by Christ, "The Good Shepherd".

On Good Shepherd Sunday, the Church asks Christians to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. There is a vocations crisis in affluent nations as fewer people hear or follow a call from God to serve him and his people in the priesthood or religious life. Christ calls each of us to listen to his voice and to follow our own particular vocation in life — which involves love for God and people. We need to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life so that the Lord's work as the Good Shepherd will be continued and his Word be preached to our own and future generations, and the Sacraments and Bread of Life may be given to people as their spiritual sustenance. If we are serious about vocations, we will pray for vocations from our own families and community. God gives each one of us a unique vocation or call, and by following it we will give glory to God, service to people, and find our own personal fulfilment and ultimate happiness.

In praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life, we ask that some amongst us may hear the Lord call them to share his ministry and work as the Good Shepherd of his people. *May the Good Shepherd protect and bless you. Fr John*
