THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Poor Jeremiah in today's first Reading! He has been sent by God to tell the Kings of Judah and the people of Jerusalem of his extreme displeasure at their turning away from their worship of him and, instead, starting to worship Baal. God's message that they would be punished, even obliterated, fell on deaf ears and Jeremiah bemoans his fate, including his public punishment, but <u>is unswerving in his trust in God</u>. In today's Gospel reading, we too are urged to be fearless in widely spreading the Christian message..

So, how should we go about this task? We all know that our faith is based upon loving God and our neighbour through our display of, for example, Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Honesty and Forgiveness. But how are we expected to encourage others to lead their lives based on these qualities, many of which are in short supply in our society. We are the modern-day equivalent of Jeremiah and need to be fearless in promoting values of which God approves.

If we are simply doing our best to lead good lives ourselves, we are already helping those around us, through our example, to become aware of values which are pleasing to God...so, we are already 'spreading the Christian message'. Jeremiah reminds us, that if we put our trust in God, he will help us to save those whose lifestyle is alien to him, and, through us, encourage them to:

- Know, trust and regularly worship God
- Not be aggressive, use bad language or display anti-social habits.
- Be friendly and helpful to everyone they meet

God needs us loudly to acclaim the changing of many values in society.
