**THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK**

What does the future hold for us? – or more to the point, what does it hold for me? As young children, amidst the excitement of the joyous experience of living in a world which is full of surprises, we wonder what it will be like when we grow up. As teenagers, we are probably too busy with today to worry about tomorrow. As young adults, we focus on the freedom of being able to decide for ourselves – or so we think! As we reach middle age – say from 50 to 80 – we have become mature enough to know that tomorrow will always be a surprise in one way or another. We just do our best to keep up with the twists and turns of life, knowing that the big surprise awaits us when God decides that the time is right for us to sample the fruits of eternity with him in heaven. But such thoughts are rarely our main preoccupation. Mostly we just ‘go with the flow!’

Today’s scripture readings invite us to raise our sights and our hearts to the future. Beyond this present life, there is much more for which to live than what we can see at present. Interesting and challenging though it is. God has planned a wonderful future for each and every one of us – in heaven. Isaiah’s prophecy of the heavenly banquet is an invitation for us to think more actively, every day, of our eternal destiny. Spending eternity with God is far more important than the short term enjoyment we might enjoy during our ‘lifetime’ on earth.

Jesus emphasises that the ‘heavenly banquet’ is available to everyone – and that includes each of us! But there is a condition. We need to remember that the special ‘wedding garment’ to which he refers in today’s parable is ‘the way in which we lead our life on earth’. Surely it must never be an option to be found to be unworthy for heaven when our time comes to meet God.
