## SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY 27<sup>th</sup> MAY 21018

#### Dear Parishioners.

Jesus said to them, "Go and make disciples of all nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I have given you" (Matt.28:16-20). Jesus gave his apostles authority to teach and baptise in the name of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit - the Most Holy Trinity. People are baptised and blessed in the name of God their Father and Creator, Jesus as their brother and Saviour, and the Holy Spirit their Comforter and Sanctifier who lives in our heart. In Catholic tradition, we bless ourselves in making the Sign of the Cross, as we begin and end prayer. In that way we call on the three persons in the Holy Trinity, The Father, The Son and Holy Spirit. Our relationship with God is centred on, sustained and blessed by these three persons in one God.

Some people can feel trapped or frustrated in relationships, and that can even apply to a relationship with God and his Church. St Paul wrote, that the Holy Spirit who lives in our hearts brings us a spirit of freedom not slavery. He says that everyone moved by the Holy Spirit is a child of God, and that we receive the dignity of being recognised as God's children in name and in fact (Rom.8:14-17).

Quite a number of our parishioners or their relatives have been very ill recently. It is most important that we lift up people to God in prayer, especially those who may not be able to pray for themselves due to the weakness which comes from illness or infirmity. Jesus, our model in prayer, prayed for his apostles and those who were to come after them, including ourselves, that we would be strengthened in times of weakness and testing. We call down God's blessing on others in prayer and surround them with his grace. Intercessory prayer is one of the most human and holy things we can do to help the sick and vulnerable. We can use our strength in the present moment to bring those who are weak to God. We ask that he heal the sick and strengthen the weak in their trials by the power of his Holy Spirit.

I ask parishioners to sign the sheet at the back of the church for an hour of prayer in the Church during our Forty Hours of Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament from the morning of Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> June until the evening of Friday 8<sup>th</sup> June.

May God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, bless and protect you. Fr John
