SIXTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME Year B 22nd July 2018

Dear Friends,

Jesus said to the apostles, "You must come away to a lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while"; for there had been so many coming and going that the apostles had no time even to eat (Mark 6:30-34). Here we see Jesus take his apostles away for a break from the busyness of life and activity, to a quiet place "where they could be alone by themselves". We could also see going away for a holiday as part of a spiritual journey with God, which we might even call retreat, in order to rest, relax and refresh. Jesus wanted to do with his friends, what we want to do with our family or friends in this holiday season. He also shows that it is important to have the right balance between work and relaxation, and then return to work renewed.

The 23rd Psalm shows that God is the Lord as the Shepherd of his people. He brings people to new pastures to give them rest; and leads them to restful waters to revive their drooping spirits, He guides them along the right path and walks with them through the valley of darkness. There is much in this Psalm to reflect on and apply to our own life and holidays at this time of year. Holidays are times when some forget about God, faith or church and go off on a self-indulgent expedition. On the other hand, many people on holiday visit cathedrals and churches to sniff-around and take-in the spiritual atmosphere of the holy places. We should thank God for holidays, when we can spend time with family or friends. Our holidays are enriched when we see them as a gift from God in which we share time with others, renew relationships, and can be re-invigorated in mind, body and spirit.

Parish life is also very much conditioned by the school and academic year, when things come to a halt over the holiday period and then start up again in September. I would like to thank everyone who has worked so hard for and in our parish over the past year. Much has happened and there have been many new initiatives for which we can be grateful, and we look forward to a fresh start in the Autumn.

Many young people are progressing to a new stage in life at this time. Some are finishing primary or secondary school, college or university, others are awaiting examination results or going to work. We ask that the Lord bless and guide them. *May the Lord by a Good Shepherd and guide to all of us at this time. Fr John*
