EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME (B) **5th August 2018**

Dear Friends,

"I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst" (John 6, 35).

In the light of the Jesus' words, let me present the life-story of Saint Albert Chmielowski. He was born on 20 August 1845 as Adam on the outskirts of Kraków (Cracow) in aristocratic family. He lost their parents during his childhood and began the initial education in agriculture at the Polytechnical Institute at Puławy. Chmielowski became involved in politics to a significant degree though later lost a leg while taking part in the Polish uprising. He was fitted with a wooden leg and offered up his dismemberment for God and the cause of Polish independence. The severe response of the Russian authorities to this insurrection forced Chmielowski to leave Poland. He settled in Ghent (Belgium) where he began his studies in engineering. During this period Chmielowski discovered his talent for painting which he began to develop. Chmielowski travelled to Paris and Munich in order to further his training in art. He was able to return to his homeland in 1874 where Chmielowski became a well-known and popular painter. His strong political convictions inspired his interest in the human condition and he developed a gentle and compassionate spirit which also made him aware of the suffering of the poor in the area. Chmielowski felt compelled to help those in need and served in the homeless shelters in Kraków. He also devoted his artistic talents to this awareness and painted one of his best-known works, known as the "Ecce Homo", which depicted the thorn-crowned Christ. Years of deep reflection caused Chmielowski to abandon his career in order to live among the poor and to accept a beggar's life. On 25 August 1887 he joined the Third Order of Saint Francis and was given the habit of that order, at which time he began to call himself "Albert". Chmielowski took up residence in the public shelter where he had been serving. In 1888 he professed his religious vows and founded the Servants of the Poor (in 1891 also women's congregation). Chmielowski died at noon on Christmas 1916 (due to stomach cancer) in the shelter that he himself had established.

When the First World War broke out in July 1914, Chmielowski sent his disciples to work in the military hospitals and infirmaries, urging them to "be good like bread ... that everyone can take to satisfy their hunger". Another time, he confessed: "I look at Jesus in his Eucharist. Could his love have provided anything more beautiful? If he is bread, let us too become bread ... let us give ourselves".

May the Lord create more free space in our hearts and minds to become like the nourishing bread that's ready on the table for all who may be hungry.

<u>TALKS ON OUR CATHOLIC FAITH</u>: In September we start a course of talks on the Catholic faith for adults interested in finding out about our faith, becoming Catholic or wishing to understand our faith or support family members' faith. It will be suitable for Catholic adults who have not been Confirmed, have not been practising, or wish to renew their faith. They will be held in the Priest's House on Wednesdays from 8pm to 9.15pm until Easter. There is no commitment involved by attending any or all sessions. Please contact Fr John if you would like to attend.

<u>WELCOME:</u> We are delighted to welcome Fr Mark Slomka from Lublin Poland, , who will be here with us until 19th August. Meanwhile, we hope that Fr John is enjoying a well earned break in Ireland.

SPONSOR A CONSECRATION CROSS OR CANDLE: Consecrated churches have twelve candles with twelve crosses around the walls of the church, to show the Church is founded on the faith of the twelve apostles. There are only four candles and crosses in our church, symbolising the four evangelists. We will celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church on December 7th, the eve of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Patron of our Church. To complete the apostolic number we will put up eight more candles and crosses. The cost of each cross is £20, and a candle holder (similar to existing ones) is £180. If you would like to donate a brass cross or candle holder, please use a red donation envelope from the back of the Church and give it to Fr John or hand it in to the Priest's House. The offerings can be Gift Aided by tax payers.
