TWENTIETH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME (B) 19th August 2018

"Do not drug yourselves with wine, this is simply dissipation; be filled with the Spirit" (*Ephesians* 5).

Wine is the most common alcoholic beverage mentioned in the Scripture, with deep and rich meaning. The biblical literature displays an ambivalence toward intoxicating drinks, considering them both a potential source of human sins and a blessing from God that brings joy. The Hebrew scriptures prescribed wine for use in festal celebrations and sacrificial rituals. Fermented wine was presented daily as a drink offering, as part of the first Fruits offering, and as part of various supplementary offerings. The banquet hall was called a "house of wine", and wine was used as the usual drink at most secular and religious feasts, including feasts of celebration and hospitality, tithe celebrations, Jewish holidays such as Passover. Jesus instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper, which took place at a Passover celebration, and set apart the bread and "fruit of the vine" that were present there as symbols of the New Covenant.

The Bible often speaks of wine as a bringer and concomitant of joy, particularly in the context of nourishment and feasting. *Psalm* 104 says that The Lord makes "plants for man to cultivate – bringing forth food from the earth: wine that gladdens the heart of man, oil to make his face shine, and bread that sustains his heart"." In *The Book of Ecclesiastes* one can read: "Go, eat your food with gladness, and drink your wine with a joyful heart, for it is now that God favors what you do" (*Ecclesiastes* 9).

The Day of the Lord, which is often understood by Christians to usher in the Messianic Age, is depicted as a time when "new wine will drip from the mountains and flow from all the hills", when God's people will "plant vineyards and drink their wine", and when God himself "will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine – the best of meats and the finest of wines".

"Wisdom has built herself a house, she has erected her seven pillars, she has slaughtered her beasts, prepared her wine, she has laid her table ... To the fool she says: Come and eat my bread, drink the wine I have prepared!" (*Proverbs* 9). May we open our minds wider to the Wisdom of God and receive the gift of Eucharist with stronger faith. "Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day" (*John* 6).
