# **THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK**

This week's 'Thought' relates to the requirement for us to put God's Law (Divine Tradition) at the forefront of the practising of our faith, and not allow priority to be given to man-made regulations (Human Tradition), which can distract us from our main focus of simply loving God and our neighbour.

The history of the Law in the Church begins in the love of God and his divine creation. In today's Gospel reading, the conflict between Jesus and the Jewish authorities over the meaning of 'tradition', highlights the need to distinguish between 'divine tradition' and 'human tradition'. 'Divine tradition' is the Christian faith handed to the Church by Christ and the lived faith of the Church through the ages. 'Human tradition' comprises helpful policy which covers relatively minor practical matters relating to the practice of the faith.

Catholic tradition is dynamic, and is always growing and developing in response to the needs of different cultures at different times. In today's Gospel, we see how Jesus tries to re-shape the attitude of the Jewish authorities with regard to tradition, as he distinguishes between human regulations and the commandments of God. The Jews in first century Palestine had evolved a law code which in its complexity was impossible to maintain. Jesus condemned those who followed the letter of this law whilst losing sight of the word of God's Law; he turns the attention of the Scribes and the Pharisees to their essential obedience to the word of God – the real Law, (divine law) which is unchanging and righteous.

The message to us from this Gospel reading is that we should look at the basic picture of what is needed to love God and our neighbour (divine law) and not focus exclusively upon petty practical behaviour (human traditions), which, whilst good to a point, do not form an essential part of God's Law.
