TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY in Ordinary Time B 16 September 2018

My dear Friends.

"I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living", we say in our response to Psalm 114 today. Walking in the presence of God is very comforting, reassuring and joyful, especially when we feel him close to us in difficult times places and situations. The three apostles closest to Jesus, Peter, James and John found comfort in being with the Lord on the holy mountain, when he was transfigured in their presence. Peter said, "Lord, it is good for us to be here" Matt.17:4). On the way down from the mountain and that wonderful experience of the glory of God surrounding Jesus, Peter rejects what the Lord was saying about his forthcoming sufferings and death on the cross, and says: "God forbid, this must not happen to you, Lord" (Matt.16:22). Jesus then speaks of the other mountain he is to climb, Calvary, and he rebukes Peter on his inability to accept his sufferings and death as part of his role as the Messiah, who is a suffering servant.

Most of us identify with Peter in our thinking about suffering and death. There is a mind-set today that we must not suffer and the tendency is to anesthetise us so that they we do not have to endure any suffering or pain. Pain and suffering can link us to the sufferings of Christ and his journey up to the mountain of crucifixion where he was glorified in a different way. He calls on us to follow him in joy and in pain, and says, "If anyone wants to come after me, let him renounce himself, take up his cross daily and follow me" (Mark 8:27-35). We instinctively honour those who lay down or sacrifice their lives to save and rescue others. Jesus laid down his life to rescue and save us, and what he did in the Gospel was prophesied in the Old Testament, and especially in Isaiah Ch.50 where it was prophesied that the Saviour would be a suffering servant who would sacrifice his life, and take insult and injury in order to bring God to people, and bring people to God.

Just as people start at school, college, university or work at this time of the year, so too things start in the parish. Last week we had a meeting for young people and parents preparing for Confirmation, and for Catechists for first Reconciliation and Holy Communion. Both meetings went very well and am I most grateful to the parishioners who have volunteered to be Catechists preparing the children and young people for first Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation. May Jesus guide them, the young people and families in this part of their faith journey.

May we have the grace to link our sufferings with those of Christ. Fr John

Twenty-five children have now been enrolled and they will have their Presentation Services at Masses next weekend. Application is now closed for this course and forms had been at the back of the church since July. It is essential that children and their families consistently attend Sunday Mass and the preparations sessions for these Sacraments.

<u>CONFIRMATION:</u> Bishop Alan will visit our parish and celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for young people who have been prepared on **24 February 2019.** Preparation will start in September for young people in school years 9 to 12 of Secondary school. Application for this course is now closed and 12 young people have been enrolled. At Masses this weekend the young people will be presented with their books for the Confirmation Course and there will be prayers offered with blessings, for the young people, their parents and their catechists.

TALKS ON OUR CATHOLIC FAITH: On Wednesday 26th September we start a course of talks on the Catholic faith for adults interested in finding out about our faith, become Catholic or wish to understand our faith or support the faith of a family member. It will also be suitable for Catholic adults who have not been Confirmed or not been practising and wish to renew their faith. They will be held in the Priest's House on Wednesdays from 8pm to 9.15pm until Easter. There is no commitment involved by attending any or all sessions. Please read the article from The Times newspaper in the church porch on, "What we did to get our child into a church school", before you ask for a reference and make an appointment to see the parish priest. This is not a nice time for clergy, with some parents engaging in manipulation to get a reference for their child, then as soon as the school offers a place they disconnect from the church - hardly ever to be seen there again! It's just so disheartening!
