## TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY in Ordinary Time B 7 October 2018

## Dear Parishioners,

Jesus said, "From the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother and the two become one body" (Mk.10:2-12). Nowadays many people seem to think that it equally moral for people to choose whatever form of relationship and intimate living arrangements from a range of that appears to suit them. The teachings in the both the Old and New Testament show this approach is not in conformity with or a living out of God's plan for people.

Our readings from the Gospel and Genesis (2:18-24) show God's plan is for a man and woman to be joined together in marriage, as one. Biblical teachings state that the relationship between man and woman is sacred, and that the fulfilment of God's plan is in the intimate union in marriage. Even though many do not accept this teaching today, it is still valid and necessary for the natural good of society. In the Gospel, Jesus states that love in marriage is to be expressed in a committed union of a faithful and lifelong relationship, which should not be adulterated or broken.

Children show God's creative love in a marriage. Today's Gospel is often read at the Baptism of children, for it shows parents bringing their children to Jesus to be blessed by him. When parents today bring their child to church, they are bringing their child to Christ and asking him to bless their little one. Children understand that in being Baptised they become a member of God's family and that he loves them. Parents help their children to grow in faith by bringing them up as active and prayerful members of the Christian family. That involves prayer at home and also coming together in God's house, the Church to pray with the other members of the Christian family. In the church Jesus blesses all of us as children of God our Father, as we bring our needs to him and thank him for his love for us. This is expressed when celebrate Mass and receive the Sacraments, and are united with God in Holy Communion.

In the weekday Masses we have been reading about the sufferings of Job and how he endured loss of goods, family, friends and health. Today our reading from the letter to the Hebrews 2:9-11 speaks about Jesus and how he was humiliated and endured sufferings, even the sacrificing of his life. Yet it was through suffering and death that he was raised up to glory. It is in that context that we can unite our sufferings with those of Christ and so give them a new and distinctly spiritual meaning. All suffering is in some way redemptive and can be associated with the sufferings of Christ.

May God bless and keep us living in his love always. Fr John
