## TWENTY-EIGHT SUNDAY in Ordinary Time B 14<sup>th</sup> October 2018

## Dear Parishioners,

"Good Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" the rich young man who ran up to Jesus and knelt before him, asked our Lord (Mk.10:17-30). Jesus questioned him on his behaviour and relationships, to see what kind of life he had been living. He was a good and upright man, seeking to do what was good and right with God and people, and wanted to do more so that he would be justified before God. Jesus challenged him with a test of love that involved sacrifice when he said: "Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor". "He went away sad, his face downcast, for he was a man of great wealth". He could not let go!

Wealth or possessions control many people's lives, rather than they being in control of them. Poverty, chastity and obedience are the three great vows many people take on entering religious life. They all involve detachment, a Christian virtue, by which we are enabled to free ourselves from some of the things that prevent us from becoming more generous, caring, loving, self-sacrificing or holy. Many saints like St Francis of Assisi who came from wealthy families, gave up a way of life and wealth to serve God and people by living a simple life of poverty, depending on the goodness of God and neighbour. In Canning Town, in our own Diocese, the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal, live in poverty and dependence on God's love, and the charity and generosity of people to sustain their life.

It is important for each of us to identify our areas of wealth or possessiveness. Our wealth could be: our pride, power and control, money, property, goods, sex, drugs, alcohol, resentment and un-forgiveness, or attitudes that cause problems. Ultimately, our wealth is what we most want to cling to most and are least give up or change. Love enables us to change willingly; and for true love we should be ready to sacrifice for what is right and good. The saints and martyrs are the great example of this. Jesus calls us, as he called the rich young man, to give up areas of life, which separate us in some way from love of God or neighbour. Only by offering to God what drags us down or holds us captive in some way, can we be truly free. By living in love we grow into the image and likeness of Christ, and we are set free and prepared to inherit eternal life.
