THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY in Ordinary Time B 11 November 2018

Dear Friends.

"People only die once and after that comes judgement, so Christ too offers himself only once to take the sins of many on himself" (Heb.9:24-28). During the month of November we remember and pray for the dead. This we do especially on Remembrance Sunday as we remember and pray for all who died in the two World Wars and subsequent conflicts. The Poppy, which people wear and use in wreaths is a sign of commemoration and remembrance of those who sacrificed their lives. We thank God for their lives and good deeds, and remember them in prayer and place them in God's hands with faith in his mercy and love.

Jesus, the Great High Priest of our faith, sacrificed his life to free people from sin and condemnation and restore us to the likeness of God. Christ's sacrifice on the Cross is made present to us at Mass. Gathered around the altar (a holy place of sacrifice) we are united as members of God's family in the Communion of Saints on earth, with all who have died and share his glory in heaven. We symbolise this in November, by placing the Names and Register of our Dead at the altar.

We remember our deceased relatives, parishioners and friends in prayer during November which is traditionally called the month of the Holy Souls. We pray that they will be purged or purified from the contamination of this world through Christ's sacrifice and be made worthy to enter fully into the glory of God.

The death and resurrection of Christ is so central to Christian faith, that St Paul said, "If Christ is not risen from the dead, our faith is in vain" (1Cor.15:14). We look to Christ's resurrection for new life for those who have died. "In Christ who rose from the dead our hope of resurrection dawned. The sadness of death gives way to the bright promise of immortality. Lord, for your faithful people life is changed not ended. When the body of earthly dwelling lies in death we gain an everlasting dwelling place in heaven" (Preface of Mass for the Dead).

On Friday, 7 December, we celebrate the Silver Jubilee of the Consecration of our Church on the feast of the Immaculate Conception in 1993. Bishop Thomas who presided at the celebration, will preside at the Silver Jubilee Mass. May it be a joyful celebration of faith as we remember and give thanks for all who have gone before us to the Lord, and left our parish a gift of faith and grace. May our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen us in faith, hope and love. Fr John
