THIRD SUNDAY IN ADVENT C Gaudete/Rejoicing Sunday 16.12.2018 THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

During Advent, we are all asked to prepare ourselves for the Christmas Season by reflecting upon how we may improve our relationship with God. To help us focus on this, it is suggested that we undertake some special act of penance, possibly denying ourselves some food or drink or favourite entertainment, or better still, do something extra to reflect our caring attitude as a loving, practising Christian. At this half-way stage of our Advent journey, we are encouraged to reflect on how we are progressing in our efforts to please God.

The Church allows a day's break from these Advent exercises, when we can celebrate our progress and thank God for his patience with us. This special day is called 'Gaudete Sunday', when we are urged simply to be joyful about God's love for us and the love we return to him, and to rejoice at the imminent celebration of the Lord's Nativity.

The word 'Gaudete' is the opening word of the original Mass in Latin:

Gaudete in Domino semper; iterum dico, gaudete, which translates as

'Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say, Rejoice'

The themes of joy and rejoicing are echoed throughout today's Mass. The Collect refers to 'glad rejoicing'; the 1st Reading urges us to 'shout for joy', whilst our response to the Psalm says that we 'sing and shout for joy'. In the 2nd Reading, St Paul says that he wants us 'to be happy, always happy'. All this encouragement to be happy leads us into the gospel reading from St Luke, where John the Baptist gives the people the Good News of the coming of Christ.

After the 'Gaudete' joyful break!! Monday re-starts our Advent inward examination of our personal relationship with God.
