## FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY C

#### 30<sup>th</sup> December 2018

### Dear Friends,

"Every year the parents of Jesus used to go up to Jerusalem for the feast of the Passover" (Luke 2:412-52). Jesus, from the beginning of his life was taken to the Temple in Jerusalem by Mary and Joseph. When he was eight days old they took him to the Temple to Present him as the first-born son to God, carrying out what was prescribed in the law of Moses. Then his divinity as well as his humanity was recognised and honoured by the holy man and woman, Simeon and Anna. At the age of twelve, when Mary and Joseph took him to the Temple, it was probably for his Bar Mitzvah, recognising that the time had now come for him to take his rightful place in the community, worshipping God, his Father.

As they journey home to Nazareth, Mary thinks Jesus is with Joseph and Joseph thinks he is with Mary, but he is with neither, remaining behind in Jerusalem amongst the teachers listening to them and asking questions. We can imagine the terrible anxiety of parents when their child goes missing. Mary and Joseph shared identify with parents in that distress and the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary of Joseph, shared the difficulties, life experiences problems that beset so many families today. When the life of their child was threatened, they fled like refugees and asylum seekers flee today to a place of safety to protect their child. Yet today we often see "those people" as a problem and do not welcome them or give them protection or a place of safety. Is our response in Europe to Paul's command to "make hospitality your special care" (Romans 12:13) truly Christian? The NIMBY (not in my back yard) syndrome doesn't apply just to local communities but also to nations. Yet, it is an essential characteristic of a holy person, a Christian family or nation to welcome the stranger and be prepared to provide places of refuge and safety for those, who like the Holy Family of Nazareth are lost or fleeing for their lives.

We not only belong to our own family in our own home but we also belong to the family of God in the Church as well as in the nation. Each one of us has the responsibility to contribute to the good of our family in the home, the church and the state. We can do that in quite ways by giving of ourselves, our time and talents and in the service of individuals and the wider community and in that way build up own family, the family of the nation and God's family in the Church.

Thank you most sincerely for your kindness and generosity to me at Christmas. I wish you and your families a very happy and blessed New Year. Fr John
