SOLEMN FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY (C)

6th JANUARY 2019

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Most of us know that the meaning of the word 'Epiphany' is 'the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi'. But how does the Epiphany fits into the great story of the development of Christianity?

Mary and Joseph were devout Jews and Jesus was naturally born into their Jewish community. But, whilst there had been many occasions of reconciliation over the years, the Jewish people had been repeatedly wayward in following him faithfully. Whilst the Jewish numbers had grown, they were still a minuscule part of society, completely outnumbered by the Romans, Greeks and many other 'non-believers'. It was evidently God's plan that this imbalance should be changed and that the influence of what we now call Christianity should be dramatically increased.

The three kings became the vehicle for informing the gentile world of the arrival of its Saviour and so the sequence became: the birth of John the Baptist to the apparently barren Elizabeth, followed by the virgin birth of Jesus and the arrival of the three kings to witness and glorify his presence. During the following 30 years, there will have been an air of uncertainty and upheaval as John and Jesus grew up. Firstly, John joined the Essene Community of monks and became a prophet, and then Jesus seems to have grown up to 28 or 29 years of age at home, as a carpenter, until he started his three-year ministry as Jesus Christ in his early thirties.

Initially, of course, Jesus addressed most of his attention to the conversion of the Jewish people, with most of the conversion to Christianity of the 'gentiles' or non-Jews, being left to the apostles and disciples after his death and resurrection. But an incredible growth in Christianity, sustained over 2000 years to the point where there are now estimated to be about 2.2 billion souls who are proud to be called CHRISTIAN!! That's 31% of the world's human population, with a simple membership requirement: TO LOVE GOD AND OUR NEIGHBOUR. The Epiphany is certainly an event which needs its annual celebration.

May God bless you - and your loving - throughout 2019!!
