THE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME C) 20th January 2019

Dear Friends,

"Do whatever he tells you" Mary, the Mother of Jesus told the servants at the wedding feast (John 2:1-12). Here, Mary tells people and us to have faith in her Son and to "Do whatever he tells you". Our relationship with God requires us to have faith in Jesus as our Saviour. In today's Gospel at the beginning of his public ministry, we see his mother, telling the servants at the wedding feast to have faith and trust in her son. St John shows us that Jesus worked his first miracle in a context of faith at a wedding, and that "He let his glory be seen and his disciples believed in him".

Jesus posed the question, "When the Son of Man (himself) comes again, will he find any faith on earth?" (Luke 18:8). Today we have a problem of faith in society. Whilst Christianity may be seen as a faith or religion that addresses moral issues and comforts people in time of need, it is much more than that. Our Christian faith brings people to Christ, just as Mary, his mother did. Our faith calls people into a relationship of faith and trust in Christ. Do we have faith to believe that Christ makes a difference to our life or to the life of other people and that he really is our Lord and Saviour?

Even though we believe that God is our Father and Creator and that he loves us, do we have faith to trust in him, and to depend on him to protect and save us? We try to do things on own initiative and we develop and try to carry out plans in our own strength. But, do we actually look at or ask what God's plan is for me? Do we have the faith to believe that if we "do what he tells us" and co-operate with him, he will fulfil his plan for and in us? Just as the servants did what Jesus had told them to do at the wedding feast, so we should do what he tells us to do here and now. When we do what he tells us, then the ordinary will be transformed into the extraordinary, and we will no longer be acting in our own strength or weakness, but with the power of God. In that way we will allow the Lord to transform lives, places and situations.

The prophet Isaiah (62:1-5) uses the image of love between a newly married husband and wife to help us understand the love God has for his people. God does not forsake or abandon his people, but delights in them and is wedded to them. Since God is totally committed to us and loves us, we should be committed to him and to each other in love. We complete a circle of love through sharing the same Spirit and using the variety of gifts he has given us to serve one another in different ways (1Cor.12:4-11).

May the Lord helps us grow strong in faith and love. Fr John
