Dear Friends.

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I consecrated you" (Jer.1:4-19). God addressed these words to the prophet Jeremiah, but they apply to every person, which is why the Church holds human life sacred from its first moment in the womb. This fundamental truth of God's love for people, from the beginning of life is shown in a small statue of a tiny infant being held in the hand of God. From the beginning of life, we are in God's hand and at the end of life we hope to return to him using the words of Jesus; "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit". Between those two moments, God will always love us and be with us as we go through the joys and difficulties of life. The popular meditation "Footprints", illustrates this reality of God being with us especially in our trials.

God calls all people to be faithful to him and to respond to his love. Jesus shows us God's love is generous and all embracing, not narrow or restricted. God's love is there for all people and it is shared and witnessed-to most powerfully by Jesus, as the Saviour of the world. He came with a sacrificial love to save us, sinners, from eternal death, to heal the sick and bring Good News to "the poor in spirit". We cannot fully understand the tremendous and unconditional love God has for us and for all people. Yet the protective love parents have for their child is a gift given to them by God, that reflects the love of the Creator for his children, yet sometimes we choose to act like rebellious children, who wish not to be caught up that love.

Couples frequently choose St Paul's hymn to love in 1Corinthians 13:1-13 for their wedding. It is the first and great Christian hymn to love and spells out the qualities of love and how to we should live them. It is delightful to listen to but challenging to live. Love is a gift that never ends, with circular wedding ring showing it has no beginning and no end. The heart is a symbol of love and when Pope Benedict visited the UK in 2010, he took for his theme the reflection by the English divine, Blessed John Henry Newman, "Heart speaks to heart". St Augustine wrote: "Give me someone who loves me and he/she will understand me". St John of the Cross gave the direction: "Where there is no love, put love and then you will find love". We respond to love by listening to God's word and following the example of Jesus who told us to "Love one another as I have loved you". He integrated the two great commandments of the Old Testament and called us to love God and our neighbour.

May God bless us with the grace to know we are loved and to share love. Fr John
