#### SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) 17th FEBRUARY 2019

#### Dear Friends,

"A blessing on the man who puts his trust in the Lord, with the Lord for his hope" (Jeremiah 17:5-8). Jesus speaks in the Beatitudes (Luke 6:17-26) of the blessings God gives to people who place their trust in him. Jesus teaches us that God does not abandon people in their difficulties or sufferings, but that he is with them and blesses them. To understand this we look to Jesus born in poverty and homelessness, whose life as a child was threatened, who experienced rejection and condemnation, and shared the sufferings and death of the innocent on a cross. Yet, in all his trials and difficulties he turned to God his Father in prayer, submitting willingly to him to save mankind from condemnation, sin and death.

Moses told the people when God was making a Covenant with them; "See, I set before you today a blessing and a curse" (Deut. 11:26). In The Beatitudes, Jesus teaches that relationships with God and people are inextricably connected. God blesses people in difficult and testing situations and shows compassion and love to those who are going through trials. God blesses people in their sufferings and sees them as brothers and sisters of Christ, who suffered to save us from sin and death. He was committed to the will of God his Father and to love of people, and calls us to have a commitment to love God and our neighbour. Commitment helps sustain our relationships and leads us live in hope and trust with God and people. Faithfulness confers the blessings of The Beatitudes on others and on us, and enables us to grow in a relationship of love with God and people.

We celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, which is World Day of Prayer for the Sick, last Monday. At Lourdes our Lady revealed herself to St Bernadette as 'The Immaculate Conception'.It is a centre of pilgrimage in the Catholic world for those who suffer and are ill. They go there to pray and be strengthened by the grace of God and supported by the prayer of fellow pilgrims. The conditions we suffer in our bodies can sometimes challenge our faith, and then we need to persevere with hope and trust in God, our Father. Our trust and hope is helped by the ways in which we support each other spiritually in prayer, and by offering practical help. We pray for our sick and bring them, and all who care for them, to the Lord at every Mass in our parish. We ask that he bless them with wholeness, and heal and free them from every ill and infirmity of mind, body and spirit.

May the Lord bless you and sustain your trust and hope in him. Fr John
