EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME C 3rd March 2019

My dear Friends,

"Do not praise a person before he or she has spoken, since this is the test of a person" (Ecclesiasticus 27:4-7). When Jesus had been arrested Peter went into the courtyard of the high priest where he was accused of being a follower of our Lord. When Peter denied that he knew Jesus as servant girl said to him, "you are a Galilean, why your accent gives you away". Our accents say a lot about us, but what we actually speak tells even more about us, "for the test of a person is in their conversation ... and a man's words betray what he feels".

Jesus takes this up in the Gospel when he says that "a man's words flow out of what fills their hearts" (Luke 6:39-45). A genuine and heartfelt love of God and of people will be reflected in our thoughts, words and actions. Where there is an absence of love there is an absence of understanding, and a failure to be merciful and compassionate to others. St Augustine said, "give me someone who loves me and he or she will understand me". The inadequacy of our love, particularly when it requires personal sacrifice, often leads us to focus on the petty faults and shortcomings of others, rather than our own. Jesus tells us to look inwards to our own faults, and not to look outwards focusing on the faults of others, which may well be minor in comparison to our own failings, and to which we can be blind.

We start the season of Lent this week on Ash Wednesday. It is a season of grace when we are called to focus on God with prayer and penance, and the needs of people through our sharing of our time, our possessions and ourselves. Please make a special effort to do something extra in your spiritual journey through Lent this year. There are simple and practical things we can do during Lent that will strengthen our relationship with God, bring us an increase of holiness and grace, and be a help to those in need. Let us seize those opportunities in this holy season of grace as part of our responsibilities as Christians.

We thank Bishop Alan for visiting our parish last Sunday and celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation for eleven young people in our parish. We offer our congratulations to them, their parents and families, as they go forward in a faith journey with the power of the Holy Spirit, and an enrichment of their faith. We are most grateful to James & Mary Ryan and Tom Day, the Catechists, who gave much time and effort to prepare the young people for their Confirmation.

May the Lord bless and guide us in our spiritual journey. Fr John
