FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT C Mothering Sunday 1 April 2019

My dear Friends,

“A few days later the younger son got everything together and left for a distant country” (Luke 15:1-32). In times past, when a person left home for a far country it was possible they would never return and their family might never see them again. Today, we can travel from one part of the world to another, and return home quickly. The younger son's problem was that he had already left home mentally, but needed money to get away. To be at home with our family and those who love us we need to be close to each other in mind and heart. We still have a problem where we may be in the same house or physically near each other but are not close to one another - being mentally in a far distant place. Transport and costs made returning home difficult in the past, but personal pride was and still is an obstacle to reconciliation between people, and with God. It was dependence and humility that enabled the younger son to return to his father and say, “Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you, I no longer deserve to be called your son, treat me as your paid servant”.

Do we welcome back and trust people who have failed as the Father of the Prodigal welcomed back his son? Do we have judgemental attitudes and condemn like the older brother, who was always with his father, but condemned and rejected his younger brother? Do we act like the younger brother and turn to others with humility expressing sorrow for the hurt we have caused and the damage we have done? Does personal pride stop us from being humble and apologising, or prevent us from reconciling?

Rembrandt's picture of the “Return of the Prodigal Son”, shows a loving Father's welcome for his humble and repentant son. Jesus shows that God our Father welcomes back the one who has strayed from him, and returns with repentance and humility. Lent is the time for us to admit our personal responsibility for offences against God and people and to express our sorrow. May we have the humility to return home to God this Lent, by confessing that we have sinned against him and people. God will warmly welcome us and forgive us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, so that we can live in a right relationship with him and one another.

May the Lord give us the grace of humility and forgiveness. Fr John
