THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

In today's Gospel reading, the woman, through her adultery, has alienated herself from God and, according to the Law, she deserved to die. But God's final word to her, addressed through Jesus, is not one of condemnation, but one of mercy and one which provides the opportunity for her to change her life for the better in future. 'Go away' he says 'and do not sin any more'.

This provides us with two thoughts to ponder:-

- How morals and standards have changed over the centuries! Today for many, sexual intercourse is virtually 'on demand', and is no longer only practised within the sanctity of marriage. We can ask: are God's standards unreasonable? Are God's laws open for debate and able to be changed to the wayward standards promoted by a wilful society? How can such wayward standards be changed-back and returned to those originally given by God in his infinite goodness? As Christian individuals who hold God's law to be sacred, what can we do to help to reverse the march of society away from God's Law?
- The true Christian must be an optimist and a positive thinker, as Jesus showed in today's Gospel, when dealing with the adulterous woman. Jesus ignored her adultery, rather focussing on whether the self-righteous scribes and Pharisees were fit to accuse her. We need to be able to ask ourselves whether we are prepared to express our thoughts publicly to support the Gospel standards and so counter the normal heated response of those who look only for justice and cannot also show mercy and forgiveness?
