FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

19 May 2019

My dear Friends,

Jesus said, "My little children, I shall not be with you much longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another; just as I have loved you, you must love one another"(Jn.13:31-35). Many people make a will to prepare for leaving life. Jesus was doing that as he told his followers he would be taken from them, and wanted them to live the "new commandment; to love one another as I have loved you".

Jesus sees love as the quality by which his followers will be identified and show commitment to God and each other. He said "By this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples". Everyone wants to love and be loved, but a love that follows the example of Christ requires sacrifices and must be total and without any conditions. Jesus said; "even the pagans love and do good to those who do good to them, in expectation of a reward". We may fool ourselves when it comes to judging the quality of our love and be blinded by self-interest.

We could use the prayer St Ignatius of Loyola gave us as a prayer of Christian love, on page 349 of our Parish Mass Book, for Prayers after Communion:

"Lord, teach us to be generous; to serve you as you desire; to give and not to count the cost; to fight and not to heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest; to labour and not to seek reward, save that of knowing we do your will, through Christ, our Lord".

Jesus showed perfect love, by sacrificing his life out of love for his Father, and for people in sin. In his Word and the Sacraments, he gives us the love of God and calls us to live in love of God and one another. St Paul gave us a plan for love and life in his great Christian hymns to love; in 1Corinthians 13:1-13 and Colossians 3:1-17. By reflecting on them in prayer or examination of conscience, we can grow in love.

In Burkina Faso last Sunday there was a terrible tragedy when terrorists invaded a church, killed the priest and six people at Mass, shot many others and burned down the church. This was the second attack in a few weeks on a Church in Burkina Faso and four more Catholics were killed during the week. Cardinal Philippe Ouedraogo, Archbishop of Ouagadougou, the capital, is one of my friends, whom I have visited and who has visited us in our Diocese. He spent the summer in our diocese at Holy Redeemer Church, Harold Hill in the 1980's. Let us pray for Christians there and around the world who are subject to terrorist attacks and persecution at this time.

May God bless us and help us grow in love for him and for one another. Fr John
