### THE BODY & BLOOD CHRIST - CORPUS CHRISTI (C) 10<sup>th</sup> June 2019

My dear People,

"Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup you are proclaiming the death of the Lord, until he comes" (1Cor.11:23-26). Paul was not a follower of Jesus and was not present at the Last Supper with Christ and the apostles. However, it is he who gives the most detailed account of what happened at the Passover Meal when Christ offered up his life as a sacrifice to take away the sins of the world. He tells us that what happened there was revealed to him directly by Christ himself. At the time of the Reformation and even today there is much controversy about the nature of the Last Supper and the Mass. In our Catholic teaching the Mass makes the Last Supper and the Mass, present to us here and now, as a meal and a sacrifice.

Jesus at the Last Supper with his apostles commemorated in the Passover Meal God delivering his people from slavery in Egypt to freedom and new life in the Promised Land. He transformed an Old Testament meal that centred on a spotless lamb whose blood was shed to save his people from death, by offering his own life as the Lamb of God in the New Testament. His blood was shed to take away the sins of the world and he offered up his life as a sacrifice to give people the new life of grace and eternal life. He took the unleavened bread of Exodus and changed it into his body, the bread of life, which he gives to us in Holy Communion. He took the cup of wine, blessed it and gives it to us as his blood, through which our sins are forgiven. What Jesus did at the Last Supper is made present to us as his sacrificial meal in the Mass. He enables us to pass-over the obstacles of this life into the new life of grace. The Body of Christ strengthens us with the food for eternal life, and through the Blood of Christ our sins are washed away.

Next Friday is the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, when we focus on Christ our Lord whose heart was filled with love for God and people. His heart aflame with the divine love shows us the love and compassion of God and gives us an example of the humble and gentle heart of God that invites and welcomes all to draw close to him. In times past people had a blessing or dedication of their homes which was centred on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We (priests) still bless people's homes when we are asked and in doing so we ask God to give his love and protection to a family and people in their homes. When we receive our Lord in Holy Communion, we can truly say that the loving heart of God is united with and living in our own heart.

May the Lord bless you and keep you safe in his love. Fr John
