FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME C **14th July 2019**

My dear Friends,

“You must love the Lord your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength and with all your mind and love your neighbour as yourself”. A lawyer quoted these words from Deuteronomy (6:5-10) to Jesus to show how people should live in relationship with God and people to share eternal life. Jesus described eternal life as knowing God and his only son, Jesus Christ. In Jesus we have the perfection of divine and human nature, for Jesus loved his Father with total and unconditional love and he loved people to the point of sacrificing his life through suffering and death. In Jesus, we see how much God loves us, and we also see how we should love God and one another, by following his example.

Many people find it easy to love God and forget about or get away from people. Others have no thought of God but love people and readily offer assistance to those in need. Jesus chose the image of a Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) as an example of a non-religious person who did not belong to the chosen people, but sacrificed all thought of personal safety to show love and compassion to someone in need. For Christians the call and challenge is to reflect on God's love for us, and how we should love him in return. An integral part of loving God is loving neighbour, for St John says: “if a person says he loves God but does not love his neighbour the truth is not to be found in him” (1 John Chapters. 3,4 5). St John's first letter tells us how to imitate Christ and in a way that balances the divine which comes from God, and the human which comes from our nature. Loving God and people delivers us from the emptiness of self-centeredness and sanctifies and redeems our human nature

Soon schools will break up for summer holidays, many families will go away for a time together and a break from work and the normal routines of life. We need time to renew relationships by relaxing together in good and creative ways. Being on holidays together should enhance relationships, in a way that is not possible during the rest of the year. It is also a time when we could become more aware of the presence of God in our lives. We ask him to bless us, and all who travel by land, sea or air, with his protection and grace. When we visit churches, as many do on holidays, we enter a sacred space in God's house and presence; where we can pray for and ask his blessing on our family and others who are in need. In that way, our prayer can help bring blessings as well as practical help to our neighbour.

May each of us be blessed with love for God and our neighbour. Fr John
