EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)

Dear Friends,

St. Paul is telling us: "Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand". In the light of these words, we recall one French saint, whose memorial is celebrated on August 4.

John Mary Vianney was born into a peasant family on May 8, 1786 in Dardilly, in the diocese of Lyon. Young John heard the call of the Lord and cultivated his vocation of bringing many souls to God. His poor results in the theology courses at the seminary led John seriously to consider giving up his vocation to the priesthood. However, he overcame the difficulty and steadfastly reached his long-awaited goal: in 1815 he was ordained.

John's first assignment was in Ecully. In 1818 he became the parish priest in Ars, which was then a town of about 230 inhabitants and which had many problems. Indifference and religious malpractice were so widespread that the people hardly noticed the arrival of the new parish priest. However, John Mary's practice of knowing people, listening to their problems, and having an interest in their lives, created a climate of trust. His tireless zeal touched the hearts of the faithful. People recognized that the shy and shaky little priest was was a committed man of God, who never relaxed his struggle to conquer souls; he was uncompromising in removing evil from people's lives. His apostolic excellence in preaching, in catechesis, in the education of young people and in charity, was fostered by his deep love and giving of self, this being fed by his prayer, penances and frequent fasting.

Interest or curiosity for him increased more and more; People turned to Ars from various parts of France, both to confess to him and to "see a saint". At the beginning of the 1930s, pilgrimages increased to such an extent that regular local transport services were introduced. He was a true martyr of confession, sometimes remained in his confessional for more than fifteen hours a day.

John ministered in Ars for twenty years. Around this simple caretaker developed a great pilgrimage of over a hundred thousand people a year. He died on August 4, 1859 and was canonized by Pius XI on May 31, 1925. In 1929 he was proclaimed patron saint of the world's parish priests.

Returning to St. Paul's letter: "Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are of the world, because you have died, and now the life you have is joined with Christ in God".

May we often pray for our parish priest and give a strong Christian witness in our life.
