TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME C 15 September 2019 Dear Friends,

The father said to his servants, "This son of mine was dead and has come to life, he was lost and is found" (Luke 15:1-32). In each of the three parables in today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of what it means to be lost and found. The shepherd rejoiced on finding his lost sheep and a woman rejoiced on finding her lost drachma. The greatest rejoicing of all was for the father whose son returned home to his family when he realised that he was lost in a loveless and uncaring world. In his impoverished state, he realised that the greatest love and security he could hope for was to be found with his father and family.

The phrase, "lost soul" is used to describe a person who has lost their way, focus or sense of security. Faith in Christ gives us the hope of redemption and restoration of relationship with God and people. Those who have separated themselves from God or people to live a self-centred or sinful way of life need only to turn back to God with humble and contrite hearts to receive mercy, forgiveness and love. On this Home Mission Sunday our Bishops, invite us to" rejoice" as the father of the prodigal rejoiced when his "son who was lost is found". People who no longer participate in the life of the Church or come to Mass are called to return to their spiritual home. There they will be welcomed by Jesus into his body, the Church. He said of someone who comes back home to God, "There is more rejoicing in heaven over a sinner who repents, than over ninety-nine who have no need of repentance".

We will start a course of talks on the Catholic Faith on Wednesday evenings, on the 25th September, from 8.00 to 9.15pm, in the Priest's House. These are to help people who wish to understand our faith, become Catholic, support the faith of family members, or take up the practice of the faith into which they were Baptised, but may not have received the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion or Confirmation. People coming to the talks can present their own questions or issues and we try to answer as best we can, in the light of the Church's teachings. There is no obligation or commitment involved in attending the course, but anyone wishing to become Catholic, would naturally be attending Mass on Sundays as part of their faith journey to and with Christ.

May Jesus help us live in right relationship with him & one another. Fr John
