26th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) 29th SEPTEMBER 2019 Dear Friends.

St Paul wrote to Timothy: "Fight the good fight of the faith and win for yourself the eternal life to which you were called"(1Tim.6:11-16). St Paul wrote two letters to the young bishop Timothy, to encourage and direct him in living a spiritual and Christian way of life. He tells him: "You must aim to be saintly and religious, filled with faith, patient and gentle". Loving our neighbour is an essential part of Christian life and flows from love of God. At a Baptism the priest asks the parents; "Do you accept the responsibility of training your child in the practice of the faith, and bringing him/her up to keep God's Commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbour"? The parents undertake the twofold and serious responsibility to bring up their child to love God and neighbour, as they answer "we do" to that key question.

Jesus in a parable shows Dives, 'a rich man who feasted magnificently every day', but did not see a poor man Lazarus covered with sores at his gates, who longed for the crumbs from the rich man's table (Lk.16). This reality was shown to me some years ago walking from Charing Cross Station to Embankment. Inside restaurant and hotel windows, diners were enjoying their dinner in comfort whilst many of London's homeless lay on the payement outside those windows, with nothing to eat and nowhere to go. Jesus told many parables focusing on care and responsibility for one's neighbour. Our world is a global village in which we can travel quickly from one place to another and we get instant information on the sufferings and needs of people anywhere. More than ever before, that means we have a responsibility for one another. John Donne wrote in the 17th century, "No man is an island, entire of itself...any man's death diminishes me, because I am involved in mankind; and therefore never send to know for whom the bell tolls; it tolls for thee". Our responsibility towards the needy at home and abroad is far greater than for those who lived in the time of Jesus. Next Friday, CAFOD Harvest Fast Day we will pray for and share our blessings with those in our world who are living in great poverty from wars, famine and disasters, and who are not blessed in the ways that we are.

The Lord wants us to bring justice to the oppressed, food to the hungry and lift up those who are bowed down (Psalm 145). Each of us can make our contribution to help people in need. Some may live near us in our area, whilst others may be far distant. Living our faith by loving God and our neighbour will help win for us the crown of glory, which Christ has prepared for all who follow his call.

May the Lord open our eyes to see the needs of others & respond to them.Fr John
