**28<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME C 13<sup>th</sup> October 2019**

***Dear Friends,***

The lepers called out: "Jesus! Master! Take pity on us" (Luke 17:11-19). The person who contracted leprosy was in a pitiable state for their social and spiritual life was destroyed as well as their health. People with leprosy were considered to be cursed by God, and their relationships as well as their bodies were broken. To prevent the spread of infection, people with leprosy were expelled from the community and banished to the wilderness, where no one lived. If people approached they they would call out "Unclean! Unclean!" when so that people would keep a safe distance.

The ten lepers who called out to Jesus for healing, stood some way off, so that they would not be stoned or seen as a threat to Christ and those with him. Jesus showed respect for the law by telling the lepers to go and show themselves to the priests as evidence of their healing, and make an offering in gratitude to God for their recovery.

Leprosy was also seen as a symbol of the sin which breaks people's relationship with God and community. Serious sin cuts us off from right relationship with God and people, for it puts self and one's own will before the will of God for people. When Jesus heals people, it is as a healing of the whole person, so that their relationship with God and the community, represented by the priests, is healed and restored.

Many in our society do not recognise sin as a leprosy, which infects people's lives and relationships. By ignoring or disobeying God's law, we reject his wisdom, that is directed towards our ultimate happiness, and put our will and ourselves first. By obeying the law of God, we may go through challenging and unhappy times, but we live in the Way of Truth. Following Christ means taking up our cross daily, by carrying out our responsibilities to God and to people. We must protect ourselves from the leprosy, which comes from the false "wisdom" that leads to the breakdown of relationships in families and society. To put God first mean we accept and live the teachings given to us in the Gospel and the Ten Commandments. When we fail, Christ wants to heal us from sin and guilt, through the grace we receive, as we show our life to him through the priest, in the Sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation.

This Sunday we rejoice at St John Henry Newman's canonisation by Pope Francis in Rome. He was a great theologian, wise and humble, who converted and entered into full communion with the Catholic Church in 1845. Pope Benedict took as the theme of his visit to the country in 2010, Cardinal Newman's motto, "Heart speaks to heart". ***May we too be led by Christ, his 'kindly light'. Fr John***

**PRISONERS' SUNDAY:** This Sunday is national day of prayer and action for prisoners and their dependents. We remember and pray prisoners, their families and their children. Prisoners' Sunday provides an important opportunity to reflect on how we act as a community can make a difference to the lives of those who are caught up in crime and the criminal justice system. It is a time to identify those who are in crisis and find themselves in need of support in our own community.
