#### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

How often have we wondered whether God is really listening to us when we pray? How often do we think of 'giving-up' in asking him for help? Does God really hear our prayers?

Of course he does, along with the prayer requests from millions of other people!! How God manages to cope with all these prayers, let alone to answer them, is a mystery to us. It must seem strange to us that the all-knowing and merciful Father needs to be told by us what we need, when he knows far better than we do what our real needs are and what we need for our ultimate good. Can we really expect God always to respond to our prayers when we have no knowledge of his specific plans for us and for our world, plans which will always be the priority?

It is an uncomfortable truth that we are creatures of need and of helplessness, but in this weekend's readings from Exodus the example of Moses, Aaron and Hur gives us a clue to how we should address God. Then, in the Gospel reading, the persistent widow gives similar guidance. There is a clear indication that we need to show perseverance in our prayers to God. However, we should not be surprised if the response is not exactly that for which we hoped.

So, if perseverance in prayer is the key, what about God's response? Firstly, we need to establish in our mind whether what we are asking of him will be pleasing to him, or whether it is just a human whim. Then, we have to be prepared to be persistent in our prayer, leaving it wholly to God to decide his response. Often God's response will need further prayer to help us to understand what he intends us to do. The strength of our faith is measured by our willing acceptance that what God wants will always be in our best interest....always!
