## Dear Friends,

The birth of a child brings great joy to parents and relatives, and forms a family that touches the wider community. The birth of the child Jesus, brings joy to Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and Wise Men, and to people through the ages, down to our own time. Jesus, the Son of God and Son of Man, became a member of the human family like us in every way, and shared the holiness of God with all men and women. In the Christian family, we thank God our Father for giving us Jesus his Son to be our brother and Saviour. In this holy season of peace and goodwill, people desire to come together as a family. Through his Son becoming part of the human family, God has placed in people's hearts the desire to be one family and to live in peace, harmony and love.

Before Jesus left this world to return to his Father, he prayed the words, "that they may be one" (John 17), so that all who believe in him would be united as one family This desire for unity in the human family is felt in the hearts of people everywhere during the Christmas season. People who cause disharmony, pain or suffering are seen to be in conflict with the nature of this season. Yet, the truth is that Jesus comes as the Prince of Peace to bring peace to people of good will and to effect reconciliation between people and with God. He comes to heal divisions in families and between peoples and nations. Through his great command to "Love one another as I have loved you", he seeks to unite people in one mind and heart. Let us ask him to help us in the Christmas season to let go of resentments, to forgive past hurts and to be lovingly united in our families.

"O God, who was pleased to give us the shining example of the Holy Family, graciously grant that we may imitate them in practising the virtues of family life. In the bonds of charity and the joy of your house, may we delight one day in the eternal rewards of heaven" (Collect of the feast of the Holy Family).

The word Eucharist, which means thanksgiving, we use to name the prayer of consecration in the Mass. At the end of the year, we thank God for the graces and blessings of the year and the ways he has helped us cope with difficulty and testing times. We also offer our thanks and gratitude to God and to others for the ways they have helped us and other people, especially in our own parish community, to serve God and one another in a much better way.

May God bless you, your families & friends with a very happy New Year.
