SECOND SUNDAY OF Ordinary Time A PEACE SUNDAY 19 January 2020

Dear Friends,

"Look, there is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world," St John the Baptist said as he pointed people to Jesus (Jn.1:29-34). John knew his mission was "to prepare a way for the Lord" so that people would receive the Messiah when he came. John testified that he saw the Holy Spirit come down on Jesus like a dove, and anoint him as the Chosen One of God. John said that the baptism by Jesus would change people's lives with the power of the Holy Spirit. John considered that the most important thing for people was to be set free from their sins by Jesus, the "Lamb of God who had come to take away the sins of the world".

In the Old Testament people sacrificed animals and creatures to God as a sign they were offering a sacrifice so that he might forgive their sins. The greatest sacrifice was that of the Passover Lamb, whose blood was sprinkled on the doorposts of people's homes as they prepared to leave slavery in Egypt for freedom in the promised land (Exodus 12:22). The blood of the Passover Lamb gave the people protection from death and enabled them to go to a new life in the Promised Land. Jesus was the Passover Lamb in the New Testament whose blood was shed on the Cross to take away people's sins and give them new life with God. That new life of grace was given completely when he rose from the dead at the resurrection, and then poured out his Spirit on all mankind at Pentecost.

We have just celebrated the joy of Christ's birth and coming in the world with light at Christmas. Isaiah (49:3-6) prophesied that the Messiah or Christ would be "the light of the nations" (non-Jewish peoples), so that God's "saving grace would reach to the ends of the earth". Sacrifice is of its nature difficult, but Jesus offered the greatest sacrifice, his life, to take away people's sins so that everyone might "live in the glorious freedom of the children of God" (Romans 8:16-21). Whilst these events and saving mysteries happened in the past, they are made present to us here and now in the Mass as the Sacred Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are read, and Christ's Sacrifice of his life, is made present to us on the Altar. In the Mass we repeatedly proclaim him the "the Lamb of God who takes away our sins and the sins of the world". In order to conform our life to Christ, and accept his grace to save us from sin and its effects we need to make our own the response in today's Psalm 39 as we say; "Here I am, Lord, I come to do your will".

May we humbly sacrifice our will to God's in love and truth. Fr John

Last year, Pax Christi coordinated times of prayer and witness, as well as making public statements to challenge the arms trade, nuclear weapons and the oppression of the Palestinian people. They have an Education Officer who works in schools and youth events to support young people in exploring peace issues and developing as peacemakers themselves.
