THIRD SUNDAY Ordinary Time: A Sunday of the Word of God 26 January 20 Dear Friends.

St Matthew in his Gospel quotes Isaiah 8:23-9:3, that "The people who lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned" (Matt. 4:12-23). We are still in winter with long dark nights, but it is already noticeable that the daylight is overcoming the darkness as the evenings begin to lengthen. Light and darkness are two of the great symbols in the Bible, especially in St John's Gospel. Light symbolises the presence of God as opposed to the darkness, which symbolises the devil. The coming of Christ as "The Light of the World", shows the triumph of goodness which comes from God, over sin which comes from the Devil. Light enables us to go forward with faith, hope and love, whilst darkness blocks us progressing in the way of virtue and gives a cover to hide what is sinful and evil.

St Matthew's Gospel shows that Jesus life, ministry and teaching was founded on the Old Testament. Matthew gives Jesus' family history showing him to be descended from significant people in the Old Testament and that his life and teachings were fulfilling the prophesies. Christ's birth is celebrated with light and candles at Christmas, and next Saturday we bless candles for use in church and our homes, as we celebrate his Presentation in the Temple. The Sanctuary lamp calls us to honour the presence of Christ in the Holy Communion which is reserved in the Tabernacle. The principal light or candle in the Church is the Paschal or Easter Candle, by the Baptism Font, symbolising Christ risen from the dead and that his life and light are present in the world, the church and our own life. The sharing of Christ's life and light is symbolised at Baptism as the Baptism Candle of newly baptised is lit from that Paschal Candle. Next weekend we will have a blessing of candles at all Masses. This will show us that we have received the life and light of Christ and that by God's grace we live and walk in the light of Christ for we are children of the light and not of darkness.

The following, is a good prayer for us to offer in our night prayers: "Lighten our darkness we beseech you, O Lord, and by your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of the night, for the love of your only Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen" (Book of Common Prayer).

May Christ, the Light of the World, guide us with his light. Fr John
