### **THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK**

It was about 700 years before Christ, nearly 3000 years ago, that God spoke to his people, through the prophet Isaiah (see today's first Reading), urging them to

Feed the hungry,
Shelter the homeless,
Clothe the poor,
Be kind and thoughtful to everyone.

Does this look familiar??!! The **needs of the poor and deprived have not changed much in 3000 years!!** We must remember that each of us is now a 'prophet' – a 'modern-day Isaiah', with the same **responsibility to love God and our neighbour** by living a good life in the eyes of God and to spread the good news to others.
