THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Peter, James and John must have been amazed and possibly terrified at the events recounted by Saint Matthew in today's Gospel reading. They had accompanied Jesus up 'a high mountain', traditionally known as Mount Tabor or the Mount of the Transfiguration. Little did they know what miraculous events they were to witness!

It would be a very worthwhile Lenten devotion to read again, preferably quietly at home, St Matthew's Gospel Ch 17 vv 1-9. Just imagine that you are actually there and **feel the glory of this awesome occasion**. How would you have responded? How would you have reacted to the supernatural events which the apostles witnessed?

As we know, our Christian faith is not simply a set of rules and proposals to which we give our quiet assent for an hour each week when we come to Mass. It is the commitment of our whole life to God, our Almighty Father, who encourages us regularly to speak to him in prayer and to show our love for him and our neighbour by the way in which we lead our lives. As we hear the account of the supernatural events on 'the high mountain', are we not moved to glorify God and pledge ourselves anew to being committed to recognising his glorious presence at every moment, in every event and in every day?

In his Transfiguration, the face of Jesus 'shone like the sun' and his clothes became 'as white as light', Does this not inspire us to recognise the presence of God, and to follow this light, every day of our life with renewed devotion?
