# PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD A 5th April 2020

#### Dear friends,

"His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as all men are" (Philippians 2:6-11). In this text, St Paul speaks of the divine and human nature of Jesus, who gave up his glory and was humble in going through suffering and death on the Cross. On Palm Sunday the Church shows us the passing nature of popularity for Christ, and people through the ages. In Holy Week, we go through his sufferings and being glorified through death on the Cross, on Good Friday. Christ, the innocent Lamb of God was put to death and through his sufferings, death and resurrection God gives the promise and hope of eternal life to all who place their faith in Christ as their Lord and Saviour.

It is sad this year that with the closure of the churches, due the Corona virus, Holy Week liturgies will be celebrated without a congregation in churches. The Mass of Chrism will not be celebrated in Holy Week, but later in the year. On Maundy (Holy) Thursday evening the Mass of Our Lord's Last Supper, when Jesus changed bread and wine into his Body and Blood and told us: "Do this in memory of me", is celebrated. The washing of his disciples feet showed his humble service and his giving us a New Commandment to "love one another as I have loved you". On that night remember his Agony in the Garden, and pray with him and for all those who are suffering their own agony and tribulations at this time.

On Holy Saturday Christians remember and meditate on Jesus in the tomb and the grief so many people suffer around the world on mourning the death of their loved ones. At the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday, we celebrate Christ's triumph over suffering and death in his glorious resurrection. In our homes, we can participate in these sacred mysteries though using online broadcasts of Holy Week and Easter services. This is the most important week in the Church's year when we celebrate God's great love for us, and the new life of grace he gives us through Christ.

This year people around the world are united in one human family sharing in the insecurity and sufferings caused by the Corona virus. These sufferings can be linked to the sufferings of Christ in this Holy Week. "By his sufferings we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5 & 1 Peter 2:24). By Jesus going though suffering and death and then his resurrection, we are given the hope of overcoming our sufferings and death, and so come to share in the glory of his resurrection and eternal life.

May Christ's sufferings and death touch our minds and hearts. Fr John
