## EASTER SUNDAY A THE RESURRECTION of CHRIST 12 April 20

Dear friends,

"Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free" we say at Mass after the bread and wine have been consecrated and become the Body and Blood of Christ. In every Mass we enter the Upper Room in Jerusalem with Jesus and his apostles at the Last Supper, we go to the Cross on Good Friday to remember his sufferings and death, and go to Easter Sunday to celebrate his triumph over suffering and death in his glorious resurrection.

On Easter Sunday morning when the women went to the tomb, the angel told them, "I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said he would. Go and tell his disciples he has risen from the dead and is now going before you into Galilee" (Matthew 28:1-10). Having first appeared to the women, Jesus walked with his disciples on the road to Emmaus, on Easter Sunday evening, "though something prevented them from recognising him" (Luke 24:13-35). In the unexpected situations and circumstances in life we do not always recognise with eyes of faith that the Lord Jesus has not only been there before us, but is also accompanying us on life's journey though we do not recognise his presence – yet he tells us, "I am with you always" (Matt.28:20).

These last weeks have been extraordinary, with the dangers of the Coronavirus affecting the way we now live and relate. Rightly, we are told to stay at home, , keep distance and stay safe and protect the National Health Service. In the NHS and caring professions, many people have been placing their own lives at risk and in danger to protect and save the life of others. We pray that the Lord sends his angels to guard and protect them in their precious vocation. We can say that in their work, they are showing God's love and sharing in his work to save people through the healing and saving power of Christ, our Saviour.

Some parishioners, with the benefit of years and long memories say they have never known anything like it. Even during the war years, the churches were not closed to people, yet the Lord and his presence is not only to be found in a holy place or building, but he accompanies us on life's journey even when we do not sense or recognise his presence. He is with us in our home and in our heart.

Thank you for your thoughtfulness, consideration and kindness at this time. Deacon Duncan & myself, wish you a holy and blessed Easter. Fr John
