FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER A Good Shepherd Sunday 3 May 2020 Dear friends,

Jesus said, "I am the gate of the sheepfold...anyone who enters through me will be safe" (Jn.10:1-10). Nowadays many people use gates to protect their security. The shepherd used the gate of the sheepfold to let the sheep enter into safety, and then he lay down at the gate to protect his herd so that one could only enter or leave through him. Jesus speaks of himself as the gate through which people may enter into safety and calls himself "The Good Shepherd, who lays down his life for his sheep". He also tells us that all who belong to him and know him, listen to his voice and follow him – safely in and out.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, we have Psalm 23, "The Lord is my Shepherd", in which the Psalmist prophesies that God will send a shepherd to call people to follow him and lead them to safety. He will nourish and feed his people; lead them to food and water, give rest to their souls and revive their drooping spirits. He will guide them along the right path, protect them from evil and free them from fear. He will comfort them and prepare an eternal banquet for them – for he will always be faithful to them. All these hopes and prophecies were fulfilled in the person and mission of Jesus, "The Good Shepherd".

On Good Shepherd Sunday, the Church asks us to think about and pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. We have a vocations crisis in the affluent nations with far fewer people following a call from God to serve him and his people in the priesthood or religious life. Christ calls each of us to listen to his voice and to show love for God and people by following him and sharing in his work of being the Good Shepherd. We need to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life so that the Lord's Word may be preached to our own and future generations, and that the Sacraments and Bread of Life may be given to people for their spiritual food. If we are serious about vocations we will pray for vocations from our own families rather than someone else's. Each of us has his or her own vocation from God. By following the vocation God gives us, we give glory to him; we serve people and find our personal fulfilment in life.

We continue patiently with this testing lockdown time due to the Coronavirus. We think of, remember, and support one another with prayer and other contacts. *May God bless and protect you and your families, and loved ones Fr. John*

This Sunday, we celebrate Christ as The Good Shepherd, who leads people and calls them to follow him as we pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.
