SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER A

17th May 2020

Dear friends.

Jesus said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations: baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:16-20). At the Last Supper, as he was about to be arrested and taken from his disciples, Jesus commanded them to "love one another as I have loved you". Before leaving them, at his Ascension, he instructed them and us to continue his mission by baptising people and teaching them the way of truth. We do not see Christ with bodily eyes, but see him with the eyes of faith, for he assures us; "I am with you always" - he has not abandoned us but gone before us and is very close to us.

Jesus' directions to his followers have shaped the Church's mission and purpose down the ages. We fail in so many ways to live Christ's command to "love one another", but his teachings set the standard on how to conduct our relationships in the best way. Before being taken into heaven, Jesus commanded his followers to share and teach his love to all peoples and nations. Jesus tells us that "all authority in heaven and earth has been given to me", and St Paul tells us "Jesus is Lord of all". Those who accept his Word and grace show faith in him by choosing to have themselves and their children baptised. Baptism is acceptance of Christ, the word of God and a willingness to learn from "him who is gentle and humble of heart". Jesus tells us to teach his Word, the Gospel, and make disciples or believers of all so that they will find God's love, forgiveness and reconciliation with God and others through him. He tells us to bring all people to Baptism so that they will be saved and counted amongst God's chosen people.

The apostles spent nine days between Christ's Ascension and Pentecost Sunday with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, waiting and praying for the coming of the Holy Spirit. We too need to pray for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit and his gifts to empower and sanctify our community and our individual life. Pray, asking the Holy Spirit to come and renew mankind with the power and love of God. We can use hymns to the Holy Spirit like: "Spirit of the living God", "Come Holy Ghost, creator come" or Come down, O Love Divine", or "Love Divine all loves excelling" or the traditional prayer to the Holy Spirit given in this newsletter.

May the Holy Spirit direct our thoughts, words and actions. Fr John

CHURCH CLOSURE: It is 8 weeks since our churches closed on 20th March. This has been a wilderness experience for all of us unable to go into church to pray or go to Mass and receive Christ in Holy Communion. It has disrupted the normal growth of life and faith for many, but especially for the children and families who have been preparing for First Holy Communion, that we would have been celebrating at this time. But it need not be wasted if we turn to the Lord in our home or room and pray in our "secret place" (Matthew 6:6) and the Lord will be there for us. We can reflect on the image Jesus gave us of "the grain of seed in the ground" (John 12:24) lying there silent and unseen, but growing in that hidden place. So let us turn to the Lord in our home and family and relate to him as our dear friend, brother and Saviour who is always there for us and with us, giving us hope and confidence in new life as we go forward.



My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"It is always a delight to meet couples celebrating many years of married life together at the annual Mass for Marriage and Family Life, as well as those at the beginning of this adventure. You won't be surprised to know that we've taken the decision not to hold a Mass this year in July as originally planned, and I hope those who would have come this year will be able to come next year instead,

I would like to take this opportunity to send my greetings to all married couples, especially all celebrating significant anniversaries this year, and all who are preparing for marriage. We recently celebrated the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, and the Church is greatly enriched by all those who live the vocation to marriage, helping their spouse and children on the path to heaven and revealing something of Christ's love for his church through their own commitment to each other. You are all in my prayers, but most especially those who are experiencing illness and bereavement. I am aware of the deep disappointment experienced by the many engaged couples who have had to postpone weddings or do not yet know how their weddings will be affected, and you too are in my prayers at this time of uncertainty.

Many families are under a great deal of pressure with all the additional stresses associated with the pandemic, and sadly some relationships will be pushed to breaking point: please do not be afraid to seek help or leave it too late to do so. Marriage Care is one of a number of organisations offering remote access to marriage counselling, and in our diocese the Brentwood Catholic Children's Society continues to provide vital support to children and families who are experiencing difficulties. As Pope Francis recently tweeted "The Family is the hope of the future. Let us pray especially for families facing serious difficulties: may Our Lord assist them"

CRIME & ESSEX COURIER FRAUD ON THE INCREASE

If you or someone you know is vulnerable and has been a victim of fraud, call Essex Police on 101. Report fraud or attempted fraud by contacting Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or call 0300 123 2040. Please see attached details of the current courier fraud. Following on from last month's alert around courier fraud, I draw your attention to a large number of these offences occurring across Essex, from Epping to Tendring to Leigh on Sea, and spreading into bordering counties.

Criminals are contacting elderly victims claiming to be from the bank, then within a very short time frame they attend the victims home purporting to be a courier to collect the victims bank card and to replace with a new card. They leave the victim with an envelope containing what feels like a bank card but transpires to be a gift card. The offenders then leave to withdraw victims' money. We have had a number of reports of men acting as the courier, often wearing a high visibility jacket – although this may not always be the case.

We ask all residents to be aware and ensure that this message is passed on to friends and family members, or those in self-isolation. If we can follow the idea of 'Tell2' – if you tell two people, who then tell two people etc, we can reach enormous numbers of people. An unbroken chain of 26 'Tell2' would reach 67 million people! Please spread this message to protect our elderly and vulnerable people. It starts with you!
