THE MOST HOLY TRINITY A God the Father, Son & Holy Spirit 7.6.2020 Dear Friends.

Jesus told Nicodemus, "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but have eternal life" (John 3:16-18). St John told us "God is love and anyone who lives in love lives in God and God lives in him". The nature of God is love and in love he created the world and shared his life and nature with all creatures. In creating the world God revealed himself in the Holy Trinity as three persons in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit - each is equal and distinct in the Most Holy Trinity. God, the Father, created the world through his Son, Jesus Christ, the Word of God who became man, and by the creative power of his Holy Spirit (Genesis 1).

The revealing of the nature of God in the Holy Trinity is unique to the Christian faith. This mystery is not only the relationship of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in God, but also the relationship between God and creation, and between God and people. When we are born into the world, it is through the creative love of God working within people, which is why human life is so sacred and also tells us our life is not our own – we are gift of God not of own making. Being born into the human family, God wants us to be in relationship with him in the Christian family, through Baptism in the name of the Blessed Trinity.

Jesus told us, "Go and teach all nations and baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matt.28:17-20) so that all people would share in the love and life of God. When we are born we take our name from our family, but through Baptism we get a Christian name as part of God's family which we are born into, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". When we bless ourselves with Holy Water and in prayer, we do so in the name of God our Father and creator, Jesus our brother and Saviour, and the Holy Spirit our Sanctifier who lives in our hearts. We should begin and end each day by blessing ourselves, and with Holy Water, ask God for his protection and grace for our loved ones and ourselves. That tells us we are living not only in the context of our own family but also in communion with God's family.

We still do not know when we will be allowed to re-open our church but have now started planning for that – and hope it will be in early July – please God!

May God the Father. Son and Holy Spirit, bless and protect you. Fr John

Their van is old and new emissions charges scheduled for next year will make it impossible to run; so they are hunting for a new van and need to raise £60,000 to get one that is fully kitted out and able to sustain the project for many years to come.
