CORPUS CHRISTI - THE BODY & BLOOD OF CHRISTI 14 June 20

Dear Friends,

"Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup you are proclaiming the death of the Lord, until he comes" (1Cor.11:23-26). St Paul was not at the Last Supper with Christ and the apostles, nor was he a follower of Jesus until his conversion. Yet, he gives the most detailed account of what happened at the Passover Meal, when Christ offered up his life as a sacrifice to take away the sins of the world. During the Reformation and even today, there is controversy between Christians about the nature of the Last Supper and the Mass. The Mass makes the Last Supper - Christ's last meal and sacrifice of his life - present to us here and now.

Jesus and his apostles at the Last Supper commemorated the Passover Meal when God delivered his people from slavery in Egypt to freedom and a new life in the Promised Land. He transformed the Old Testament meal, which had at its centre a spotless lamb whose blood was shed to save the people from death, by offering his life as the Lamb of God in the New Testament. His blood was shed to take away the sins of the world and he offered up his life as a sacrifice to give people the new life of grace and eternal life with God. He took the unleavened bread of Exodus and changed it into his body, the bread of life, which he gives to us as Holy Communion. He took the cup of wine and blessed it and gives it to us as his blood, through which our sins are forgiven. What Jesus did at the Last Supper is made present to us in the Mass. He enables us to pass-over the obstacles of this life and enter into communion with him, in the new life of grace. The Body of Christ is given to us as food for eternal life, and his Blood is given to wash away our sins and purify us for eternal life.

On the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Friday next, we focus on our Lord whose heart burned with love for God and people. He shows us the compassion and love of God and gives us an example of the humble and gentle heart of God. He says "come to me for I am gentle and humble of heart, come to me and you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew 11:29). In the past people had their home blessed and dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We bring Him into our home and family with prayer and grace that gives us compassionate and loving hearts.


