#### FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME A Sunday 5 July 2020

#### My dear Friends,

Jesus said, "Come to me all you who labour and are heavily burdened and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me for I am gentle and humble of heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matt.11:25-30). Jesus shared people's joys, sorrows and burdens. When life is burdensome or hard, we may feel alone. In those times, we need and value the support that others give us. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us not withdraw into our shell, in the difficulties of life but to come to him who will bear our burdens with us and strengthen us.. He says, "If anyone will come after me, let him take up his cross daily and follow me". Our responsibilities and duties and are mostly welcome joys and challenges, but sometimes they may be an agony in the garden. Jesus lived in faithfulness to the will of his Father, but prayed, "Father, if it is possible let this chalice pass me by, but not my will but thine be done". He, who was gentle and humble calls us to find rest in him.

This leads us to question how we cope with the stresses and difficulties of life, especially at times like this. Do we see Christ as our Saviour and turn to him when we are in difficulty or in need of help. If we do not bring our problems to him believing he can help to change our situation, then we are not really recognising him as our saviour. Jesus constantly turned in prayer to his Father before making big decisions, teaching or miracles. He needed the help of his Father, but with our limitations and human weaknesses, we need God's help even more. We need to turn to Christ each day in prayer, especially as we say the Lord's Prayer, and ask that God's will be done in us and through us, as it is in heaven. Jesus power to save us comes from and through his Cross. As we bless ourselves in making the sign of the Cross, may we realise that he is with us all the time, blessing us and supporting us.

I wish to thank you for your prayerful and practical support, concern and help over the past months. Even though celebrating Mass and praying alone, I was always aware that prayer was going up to God for all our people and those in need of help and healing, who could not be present in the church.

<u>CHURCH REOPENS:</u> Our Church reopened for limited times last week for people to come and pray in private. We are most grateful to Zoe & Barry, Emma who made this possible. We thank the Stewards/ Ushers who were in attendance and ask for continued help in this regard in the days and weeks ahead.

Regrettably, we are not able to have Masses with people present this weekend, as we have not received the required authorisation. Masses will have to be in church rather than the hall, as preschools are the only things that can legally happen in halls at this time. We hope to have the permission for Mass with people present for the coming week and for next Sunday's and weekend Masses. For people's safety, we must ensure we are compliant with all the conditions of opening and cleansing.

Government has given permission for churches in England to resume the celebration of Mass provided all necessary and reasonable COVID-19 precautions are in place. To ensure the safe opening of our church and prevent a further transmission of the virus and avoid contributing to a second wave, we ask you to please follow the instructions below:

- We are maintaining the social distancing of 2 meters in our Church for people who don't live in the same household. This has an impact on how many parishioners we can accommodate in the Church at any time.
- Our church can safely accommodate in total a minimum of 23 people or a maximum of 54 depending on the number or families or single households.
- Each family (max 4/5) will have a pew whereas two single households will share a pew. Not all pews can be used due to distance fore and aft.
- Due to this restriction in numbers and to avoid parishioners being unable to
  enter once the church is full, please let Fr. John know if you are going to
  attend any of the weekend services, you can do this by:
  - o Email: admin@eppingparish.plus.com or Tel: 01992 577173
  - o Note/letter into The Priest's House at 11, Church Hill, Epping. If you can do so, it may be advisable, to attend a weekday Mass.

Please follow the direction signs, depending on numbers and you may have to queue to enter the Church in a protected way.

- Please arrive early as our Ushers will direct you to your seat we will seat from the front, you will not be able to choose where you want to sit. Special arrangements will be made for people with a disability.
- The Sunday Offertory collection will be taken in a basket as you enter the church, or you can make an online donation at <a href="https://www.dioceseofbrentwood.net/donations?parish=epping//">https://www.dioceseofbrentwood.net/donations?parish=epping//</a>
- As you enter the church please sanitise your hands.
- There will be A one-way system in operation.
- Do not leave your seat until instructed for Holy Communion, when it is your turn, please take your belongings with you.
- Holy Communion will only be given in one form, the Host on the hand. One's hand should be stretched out fully to preserve distance.

- Once you have received Holy Communion, leave via the Sacristy and sanitise your hands as you leave, from the unit in the sacristy porch.
- Father John invites you to pray by the Crucifix in the Car Park after Holy receiving Holy Communion whilst keeping 2 metre distance for others.
- Please disperse quickly as the Church will be closed for cleaning and avoid breaches in social distancing.
- Toilets will be closed to the public unless for exceptional circumstances
- If you have symptoms of COVID –19 or live with someone who has the symptoms, please do not come to church but stay safe at home.
- There is no obligation on people to attend Mass at this time due to the risks and dangers from the coronavirus pandemic.

**PRIVATE PRAYER:** Our Church will be open for private visits and prayer, in addition to the Mass times, next week - on Monday from from 7.00pm to 8.00pm, Wednesday from 7.00pm to 8.00pm, Friday from 7.00pm to 7.30pm (Mass at 7.30pm). On Saturday the Church will be open from 10.00am to 11.00am. The Church must be cleaned before each period of opening.
