EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME A 9th August 2020

Dear Friends,

"Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind he took fright and began to sink and cried out 'Lord, save me"(Matthew 14:22-33). This Sunday's Gospel tells us of the turmoil the disciples with the storm on the lake and their boat far out from the land. There can be turmoil and storms not only on the sea but on the land, between and in countries, and in our own lives. Sometimes people, and ourselves too, can feel that we are being buffeted and uncertain and we want to cry out to God or Jesus, "Save me".

Elijah, the prophet, was confronted with the forces of nature in the storm, the earthquake and the fire (1Kings 19:9-13). WhilstGod, the Creator, is always present whatever the situation, but it was only in the gentle breeze, the "still small voice of calm", that the prophet recognised the God, who was present but unseen. We can recognise situations in which people find themselves beset by the storms of life; health problems, troublesome relationships, threats from the forces of nature or the terrible disaster in Beirut this week, in which many lives were lost or destroyed. In all those situations and circumstances, we look for a Saviour and like Peter in the storm on the lake we can cry out, "Lord save me or us".

In our noisy world, we need to hear the voice of God in gentleness and quietness. His voice is quiet and gentle for it is the voice of love. He speaks in the most hidden parts of our being and the promptings of our conscience. For those who know how to listen, God's voice can make itself heard even in the midst of storms and turmoil. Over the roar of wind and the waves, the apostles heard the gentle voice of Jesus saying to them, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid' (Matt 14:22-23). Like Peter we may set out confidently across the waters of life, but as soon as the wind of troubles rise against us and the waves of adversity buffet us, we lose our nerve and begin to sink. Jesus' rebuke, 'Man of little faith! Why did you doubt?' is directed at us too. We ask the Lord to help us keep focused on him to strengthen our faith as we call on him to "Save us". *May God bless and save you. Fr John*

OUR CHURCH IS OPEN FOR MASS and we are grateful to the Stewards/ Ushers who have managed the church for Masses over the past few weeks.

We must comply with statutory and diocesan conditions and precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 virus and remain open. The most important principles are:

- Face coverings are obligatory in the church unless you are exempt
- Please maintain a social distance of 1 metre from the people who do not live in your household unless you are exempt from wearing a face covering. Then you must maintain a social distance of 2metres.
- Enter by the Church door & leave by the Sacristy, in a one way system
- Sanitise your hands as you enter and leave the church.
- Do not touch things in the church other than at the place where you sit.
- Each family will have a pew for 4/5 people. Two single people from different houses will share a pew to keep social distance or a couple and one other person from a different household can share a pew.
- Arrive early for the Ushers to direct you to your seat. Special arrangements are made for people with a disability.
- The Offertory collection is taken as you enter the church, or donate online at: <u>https://www.dioceseofbrentwood.net/donations?parish=epping//</u>
- To receive Holy Communion or a blessing, do not leave your seat until guided by the Ushers. On Sundays, please take your belongings with you, as you will not return to your seat.
- Communicants should unloop their face covering and consume the Sacred Host and then replace their face covering.
- Holy Communion will be given to you only from the host into the flat of your outstretched hand, as you stand.
- When you have received Holy Communion, leave the church immediately by the Sacristy & sanitise your hands at the dispenser in the Sacristy porch.
- Please disperse quickly to avoid breaching social distancing. The Church has to close for cleaning after each Mass, in preparation for the next Mass.
- The Hall toilets cannot be used at this time.
- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or live with someone who has the symptoms, please do not come to church but stay safe at home.
