TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A 23rd August 2020

Dear friends,

Jesus said, "You are Peter and on this rock I will build my church and the gates of the underworld will never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 16:13-20). Jesus asks the disciples, his friends, "Who do people say I am?" He did not have a crisis of identity but wanted to know what understanding people had of him and his mission. They gave him various answers but it was to Peter that the grace of faith had been given by God to recognise Jesus as "The Christ, the Son of the living God". Jesus' response was, that the faith Peter had just professed was gift of God, and that underpins our Christian belief that faith is gift of God, given to some but not to all – which we recognise from experience!

Since Peter had the grace of faith, Jesus chose him as "the rock on which to build his church and gives him the keys of the kingdom of heaven". Keys are the symbol not only of Peter but also of the Pope, who as the successor to Peter articulates the faith of the church and confirms the faith of his brothers and sisters. Peter was not perfect and let Jesus down because of his fears and human weaknesses. The fact that Jesus still chose Peter, and placed his trust in him, shows Christ redeeming frail human nature.

Keys are a symbol of the power to lock or unlock. For months we have had "lockdown" to keep an enemy virus out of our homes and lives. People lock doors for security and to keep out those who would harm them. People are locked up in prison but welcome the power exercised by a person with keys to let them out. Jesus set Peter free after his fall and gave him and his successors the power to set us free "from the slavery to decadence" or "bondage to decay" so that we might share in "the glorious freedom of the children of God" (Romans 8:21).

In Catholic tradition and ministry being set free from our sins and failings is exercised in a grace-filled way in the Sacrament of Penance, Confession or Reconciliation. Yet, many of us do not recognise our need to be set free by being forgiven. The Beatitudes (Matt.5) begin with, "Blessed are those who know their need of God". We need blessings to know our need to be forgiven and to forgive others. *God bless and protect you. Fr John*

<u>OUR CHURCH IS OPEN FOR MASS</u> and we are most grateful to the Stewards/ Ushers who have managed arrangements in church for Masses over the past weeks.

We must comply with statutory and diocesan regulations and precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 virus and remain open. The most important principles are:

- Face coverings are obligatory in the church unless you are exempt.
- In wearing a mask or face covering maintain social distance of 1 metre from the people not living in your household. If you are exempt from wearing a face covering you must maintain a distance of 2 metres.
- Enter by the Church door & leave by the Sacristy, in a one way system
- Sanitise your hands as you enter and leave the church.
- Do not touch things in the church other than at the place you sit.
- Each family will have a pew for 4/5 people. Single people from different houses will share a pew to keep social distance or a couple and one other person from a different household can share a pew.
- Arrive early for the Ushers to direct you to your seat. Special arrangements are made for people with a disability.

- To receive Holy Communion or a blessing, do not leave your seat until guided by an usher. **On Sundays**, please take your belongings with you, as you will not return to your seat, but leave by the Sacristy.
- Communicants should unloop their face covering and consume the Sacred Host and then replace their face covering.
- Holy Communion will be given to you only from the host into the flat of your outstretched hand, as you stand at a distance from the priest.
- On Sundays when you have received Holy Communion, leave the church immediately by the Sacristy & sanitise your hands in the Sacristy porch.
- Please avoid breaching social distancing by dispersing. The Church has to close for cleaning after each Mass, in preparation for the next Mass.
- The Hall toilets cannot be used at this time.
- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or live with someone who has the symptoms, please do not come to church but stay safe at home.
