TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A 30 August 2020

Dear friends,

Jesus said, "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:21-27). Jesus made three prophecies of his approaching passion, death and resurrection. The most poignant one is when he was coming down from the mountain where he was transfigured in prayer, and spoke of Calvary, the other mountain he would climb, to be crucified and glorified. The reaction of Peter and the apostles who were with him at that time was expressed by Peter who said, "Heaven preserve you, Lord, this must not happen to you". They did not think they were associating themselves with someone or a project that would end in suffering and death, but thought they would be occupying important positions and status in a new kingdom of Israel.

To be called to serve God or people is a privilege, which is why we use the word "Vocation" to describe that service. To respond to a vocation requires renouncing self and putting first the response and responsibility to God and to people. That can involve self-sacrifice, like Jesus committed himself to when he did not run away from sacrificing himself in suffering and death. Yet, his disciples' response to his prophecy and arrest in the garden of Gethsemane was to run away, which we too might be tempted to do

Jeremiah, (Ch.20:7-9) like the other prophets, felt mocked, insulted and derided for carrying out his responsibilities as a Prophet and preaching the Word of God. He wanted to escape and run away from the mission to which God had called him – yet there was a "fire burning in his heart and imprisoned in his bones" that compelled him to carry out his vocation.

A person who loves and is in love with another, or parents with love for their child(ren) should be able to understand and respond to this instinct which is a gift of God, given to us in our heart. Putting self first, the me complex and self-fulfilment are the fashion of our time. When we pursue those lines of thinking or ways of life we soon come to realise that we want more and are not really happy or satisfied. So, to serve God and others, we ask the Lord to give us a self-sacrificing disposition and a generous heart. *May the Lord bless you in your own special vocation. Fr John*

OUR CHURCH IS OPEN FOR MASS and we are most grateful to the Stewards/ Ushers who manage arrangements for the Masses in church over the past weeks.

We must comply with statutory and diocesan regulations and precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 virus and remain open. The most important principles are:

- Face coverings are obligatory in the church unless you are exempt.
- In wearing a mask or face covering maintain social distance of 1 metre from the people not living in your household. If you are exempt from wearing a face covering you must maintain a distance of 2 metres.
- Enter by the Church door & leave by the Sacristy, in a one way system
- Sanitise your hands as you enter and leave the church.
- Do not touch things in the church other than at the place you sit.
- Each family will have a pew for 4/5 people. Single people from different houses will share a pew to keep social distance or a couple and one other person from a different household can share a pew.
- Arrive early for the Ushers to direct you to your seat. Special arrangements are made for people with a disability.

- To receive Holy Communion or a blessing, do not leave your seat until guided by an usher. **On Sundays**, please take your belongings with you, as you will not return to your seat, but leave by the Sacristy.
- Communicants should unloop their face covering and consume the Sacred Host and then replace their face covering.
- Holy Communion will be given to you only from the host into the flat of your outstretched hand, as you stand at a distance from the priest.
- On Sundays when you have received Holy Communion, leave the church immediately by the Sacristy & sanitise your hands in the Sacristy porch.
- Please avoid breaching social distancing by dispersing. The Church has to close for cleaning after each Mass, in preparation for the next Mass.
- The Hall toilets cannot be used at this time.
- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or live with someone who has the symptoms, please do not come to church but stay safe at home.
