TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY in Ordinary Time A 13 September 2020

Dear friends,

Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?" Jesus answered, "Not seven, I tell you, but seventy seven times" (Matthew 18:21-35). We all know the phrase: 'To err is human; to forgive, divine' (Alexander Pope's Essay on Criticism). Pope explained that, while anyone can make a mistake, we should aspire to do as God does, and with his help offer mercy and forgiveness to those who sin or offend. Peter felt, as we can, that there may be a limited number of times we be expected to forgive one who offends, hurts or sins against us. He thought seven times would be generous. Forgiveness can be one of the hardest things to do, but it is the greatest thing that a person who has suffered grievously can offer. Jesus, as he was dying on the Cross, prayed for those who were inflicting terrible sufferings on him, as he said to God, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34).

Down the ages and in our time there have been good people who imitated Jesus' example and showed astounding forgiveness to those who hurt them dreadfully. The lives and deaths of good people, and the saints and martyrs of England and Wales challenge and inspire us. To those who showed them no mercy, they offered forgiveness in their agonies. People like St Anne Line from Dunmow, St John Paine at Ingatestone, or St Thomas More at Chelsea, are just a few of those who prayed for forgiveness for those who inflicted suffering and distress on them and their loved ones.

We may think of those who have hurt us, or feel we cannot let go of hurt and be unable to forgive. Some people can be charged with resentment from hurts and be trapped in un-forgiveness. People who have suffered abuse or assault can suffer from hurts that are imprinted in their memory and never seem to go away. In those circumstances, they and we turn to Christ, our Saviour and the author of all healing who ministers forgiveness, and we ask him to heal hurts and enable victims or survivors to go forward as a healed, saved and whole (holy) person. We pray daily, that the "Lord, forgives us, and enables us to forgive those who sin against us".

May the Lord bless and protect you and your families. Fr John

<u>OUR CHURCH IS OPEN FOR MASS</u> and we are most grateful to the Stewards/ Ushers who manage arrangements for the Masses in church over the past weeks.

We must comply with statutory and diocesan regulations and precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 virus and remain open. The most important principles are:

- Face coverings are obligatory in the church unless you are exempt.
- In wearing a mask or face covering maintain social distance of 1 metre from the people not living in your household. If you are exempt from wearing a face covering you must maintain a distance of 2 metres.
- Enter by the Church door & leave by the Sacristy, in a one way system
- Sanitise your hands as you enter and leave the church.
- Do not touch things in the church other than at the place you sit.
- Each family will have a pew for 4/5 people. Single people from different houses will share a pew to keep social distance or a couple and one other person from a different household can share a pew.
- Arrive early for the Ushers to direct you to your seat. Special arrangements are made for people with a disability.
- The Offertory collection is taken as you enter the church, or donate online at: https://www.dioceseofbrentwood.net/donations?parish=epping//
- To receive Holy Communion or a blessing, do not leave your seat until guided by an usher. **On Sundays**, please take your belongings with you, for you will not return to your seat, but leave by the Sacristy.
- Communicants should unloop their face covering and consume the Sacred Host and then replace their face covering.
- Holy Communion will be given to you only from the host into the flat of your outstretched hand, as you stand at a distance from the priest.
- On Sundays when you have received Holy Communion, leave the church immediately by the Sacristy & sanitise your hands in the Sacristy porch.
- Please avoid breaching social distancing by dispersing. The Church has to close for cleaning after each Mass, in preparation for the next Mass.
- The Hall toilets cannot be used at this time.
- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or live with someone who has the symptoms, please do not come to church but stay safe at home.
