TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A 4 October 2020 Dear Friends.

Jesus told the parable, "The landowner planted a vinevard, fenced it round, dug a winepress, leased it tenants and went abroad" (Matthew 21:33-43). The vineyard and the vine were powerful images for the Jewish people. God led his people out of slavery in Egypt and says "I brought you like a vine out of Egypt" (Ps.79). Last Sunday we had the parable of the vineyard owner asking his two sons to go and work in his vineyard, but they were self-centred at that moment and refused to go. People who live on and from the land have a real attachment to their land, and are as much rooted to it as the vines or crops they cultivate on it.

This weekend we are planting two vines in our church grounds for they symbolise to us what Jesus said, "I the vine and you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much, for apart from me you can do nothing (John 15:5). Jesus was giving the parable to a group who knew they were "God's chosen people" and thought that belonging to the group was all that mattered. Jesus challenged them just as he challenges us, to bear good fruit in the way we think, speak and act, for he says "By their fruits you will know them" (Matthew 7:15).

We are part of the Lord's vineyard and through Baptism we are grafted on to him. Though he left the world in body terms at his Ascension into heaven, he is the master of the vineyard who will return. Then he will call us to account as to how we have used the talents and gifts he gives us as individuals and as a nation. He requires us to use them in ways that serve the needs of others and give glory to God. In recent times, there has been a decadent populist culture of centring on self as an individual and a nation. Putting self first is worst for it panders to our selfish instincts but goes against Biblical teaching in both the Old and New Testaments, which commands people to focus on love of God and neighbour.

We also see in this parable, violence by the tenants who seek to get what does not belong to them, without any respect for the rights or life of others. That kind of violence and arrogance, in terms of arrogating to one's self, what one has no right to or does not belong to one is not far away from us nowadays. What kind of Gospel or philosophy leads or guides is a key question for us as individuals and as a society. Do we want to bear good and life-giving fruit in society and in our own lives and thus contribute to the common good for the benefit of all?

May Jesus, the Lord of the Vinevard, help us bear fruit in good works. Fr John

We must comply with statutory and diocesan regulations and precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 virus and remain open. The most important principles are:

- Do not touch things in the church other than at the place where you sit.
- Each family will have a pew for 4/5 people. Single people from different houses can share a pew to keep social distance or a couple and one other person from a different household can share a pew.

- To receive Holy Communion or a blessing, do not leave your seat until guided by an usher. **On Sundays**, please take your belongings with you, as you will not return to your seat, but leave by the Sacristy.
- Communicants should unloop their face coverings and consume the Sacred Host and then replace their face covering.
- Holy Communion will be given to you only from the host into the flat of your outstretched hand, as you stand at a distance from the priest.
- On Sundays when you have received Holy Communion, leave the church immediately by the Sacristy & sanitise your hands in the Sacristy porch.
- Avoid breaching social distance by dispersing and not mingling. After each Mass, the Church must close for cleaning, to prepare for the next Mass.
- The Hall toilets cannot be used at this time.
- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or live with someone who has the symptoms, please do not come to church but stay at home, safe.
