### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

On Friday we celebrated the Feast of St John Henry Newman (1801 – 1890), the most recent English saint. He was first an Anglican priest and later became a Catholic priest and Cardinal. He was an important figure in the history of England in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Following the authentication of two miracles, he was declared a saint on 13<sup>th</sup> October 2019. Last weekend, Fr John circulated copies of a card which contained some of St John Henry's thoughts on 'My Vocation'. The text is food for thought and can be seen as encouraging for each of us today, whatever our walk of life. John Henry Newman wrote:

'God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission – I never may know it in this life, but I shall be told in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connexion between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do his work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling.

Therefore, I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him; if I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. My sickness, or perplexity, or sorrow may be necessary causes of some great end, which is quite beyond us. He does nothing in vain; He may prolong my life, He may shorten it; He knows what he is about. He may take away my friends; He may throw me among strangers. He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide the future from me – still, He knows what He is about'.
