THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A 25 October 2020

Dear Friends,

A Pharisee asked Jesus, "Master. Which is the greatest commandment of the Law" and Jesus replied "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your willand you must love your neighbour as yourself" (Matthew 22:34-40). Many years ago I remember a married couple saying, "Love is a decision" and when I have subsequently said that to many people they generally responded by saying "That sounds rather cold". Nowadays we often associate love with good feelings and do not necessarily think of it as a decision to go beyond self love and to commit ourselves to love God and love people.

We can also say love is sacrifice. We honour countless people because they did not put themselves or their own life first, but spontaneously sacrificed themselves for the sake of others. Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than to lay down their life for their friend", which he did at the end of his life (John 15:13). St Paul tells us "God loved us while we were still sinners and enemies of God" (Romans 5:8). God's love for us is total, unconditional and all embracing, and it is shown most powerfully in the person of Jesus, our Master and Teacher, our older brother and Saviour who laid down his life for us.

Love can and needs to be expressed in words, and the words have to be confirmed by the actions that follow. Where is the love when a person or nation oppresses or rejects another or others? Where is the love when a person inflicts suffering or pain on another? Where is the love when someone is unfaithful to another or to their word, or when they exploit or takes advantage of others in time of need?

St Paul gave us the great Christian Hymn to Love saying, "Love is patient and kind; it is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrong but rejoices in right. It bears all things; believes all things; hopes all things; endures all things. Love never ends" (1Corinthians 13:4-8). He wrote I On Colossians 3:14, "Above all, clothe yourself with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony". Many couples choose these beautiful hymns to love for their wedding, but I still remember a preacher saying that we should use these words to examine our conscience and ask myself, "Am I patient and kind, jealous or boastful etc"? Then we may get the measure of love in our life and perhaps recognise our need to be more altruistic and sacrificial in our love. *May God bless and keep you safe in his love. Fr John*
